Subject: Affordable Housing Week

The City of Bellevue recognizes that all people should have access to safe, healthy and affordable housing. Among the Council's adopted two-year priorities is to "develop an affordable housing plan for the needs of our diverse population".

The City has many partners in addressing affordable housing, including member jurisdictions of ARCH, A Regional Coalition for Housing, and local housing nonprofits including the Housing Development Consortium.

The issues of affordable housing and homelessness have hit a crisis point in our area. Across King County, 127,000 households are paying more than half their income for housing costs, and 4,505 individuals were found sleeping outdoors during the 2016 One Night Count. These challenges are touching every corner, every city, and every school district of King County. During the 2014-15 school year, 7,260 students across King County were identified as homeless, including 220 students in the Bellevue School District.

We know we must do more to address these needs. By increasing attention to this issue and by working together, across jurisdictions and across sectors, we can turn the tide to ensure all people have access to a safe, healthy, affordable home.

In December 2015 Bellevue initiated the Affordable Housing Strategy, to implement new tools to ensure affordable housing opportunities are available throughout the City at a range of affordability levels.

As the City's Affordable Housing Strategy effort continues, we recognize the need to increase affordable housing in Bellevue by pledging to declare **May 16-22 Affordable Housing Week**. Through Affordable Housing Week, we are working with our partners to elevate understanding of the need for affordable housing and discuss potential solutions.
