LUCA Updates

- Lower minimum tree credit requirements for nonresidential uses in residential Land Use Districts
- Added initial in-lieu fee value
- Three-year lookback replacement ratio consistent with BCCA proposal
- Revisions to clarify intent:
 - Conditions for tree removal on low canopy sites
 - Priorities for tree retention
- Ongoing coordination with CAO, confirmed consistency with GMA

BCCA Objectives

- Affordable permit for every significant tree
- Allow for limited tree removal without complex analysis or review
- Incorporate replanting
- Evaluate enforcement tools
- Support better tracking data



Monetary Penalties

Current Approach

- Must attempt voluntary compliance first
- Ability to impose value-based fines for certain illegal tree removal:
 - Illegal removal on City property
 - Violations of LUC 20.20.900 (Tree Retention)
- Hearing examiner process to determine final penalty

Monetary Penalties

Proposed Updates

- No obligation to pursue voluntary compliance first
- Update expands circumstances when value-based fines may be pursued
- Adds ability to seek double fines for repeat violations on private property
- Updated minimum penalty
- Updated valuation reference
- Hearing examiner process to determine final penalty

Tree Removal Permitting and Replacement

Current Approach

- Permit not always required, except in Bridle Trails
- Difficult to confirm a violation has occurred
- No way to track tree removal consistently
- Replacement required in limited circumstances

Tree Removal Permitting and Replacement

Proposed Permit Requirements: Residential Districts

- New "quick review" tree removal permit
- Available for limited tree removal on residential sites
- No replacement or arborist review required
- Provides for tracking, review for activity which could require additional review/permitting

Tree Removal Permitting and Replacement

Conditions for "Quick Review" Residential Tree Permit

Site Size	Annual Replanting Threshold*	Significant and/or Landmark Trees to Remain
Up to 10,000 sf	1 landmark or 2 significant	2
10,001 - 20,000 sf	1 landmark or 3 significant	3
20,001 - 40,000 sf	1 landmark or 4 significant	4
40,001 + sf	1 landmark or 4 significant	8

^{*} Hazardous tree removal does not count to limit

Tree Removal Permitting and Replacement

Tree Replacement

- Replacement required if removal not eligible for "quick review" permit
 - Not required for hazardous trees
- Replacement Ratios:
 - Significant Trees: 1:1
 - Landmark Trees: 3:1, can be reduced to 2:1 if large conifers
 - Can demonstrate minimum tree density achieved to reduce
- Trees planted or retained for development regulations must be retained unless hazardous

Implementation

- Education and Outreach
 - Tree planting guide
 - User guides for staff and public
 - Outreach to community, tree service providers
- Internal team developing:
 - New permit type and fee
 - Consistent permit system fields and reporting
