- Current AHS adopted in 2017
- Original target, 2,500 affordable units new and preserved between 2017-2027
- 2,750 have since been built or are in the pipeline

Actual:	1,899 units and 190 shelter beds, in-service	661 pipeline units

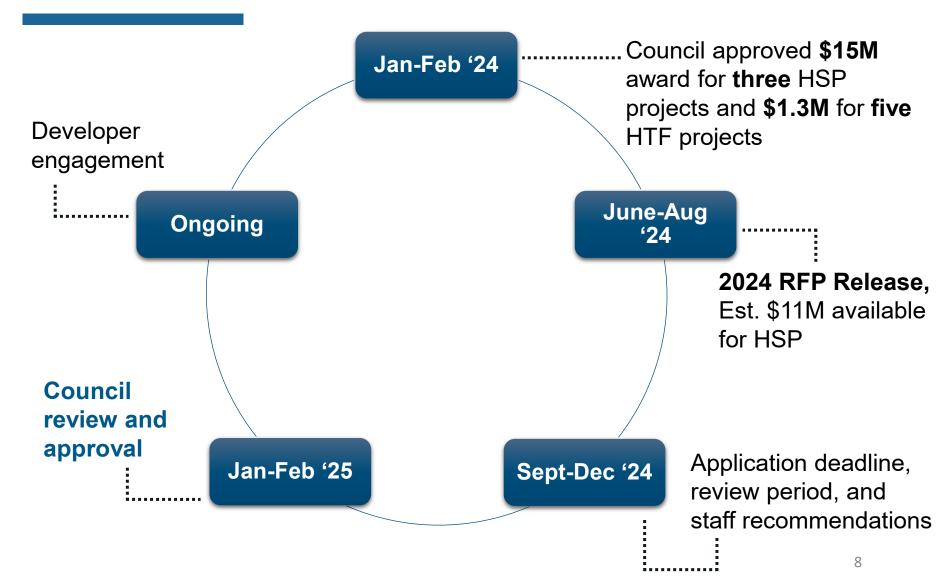

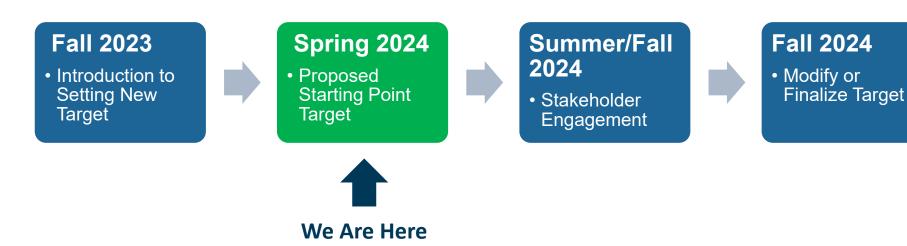

Approach



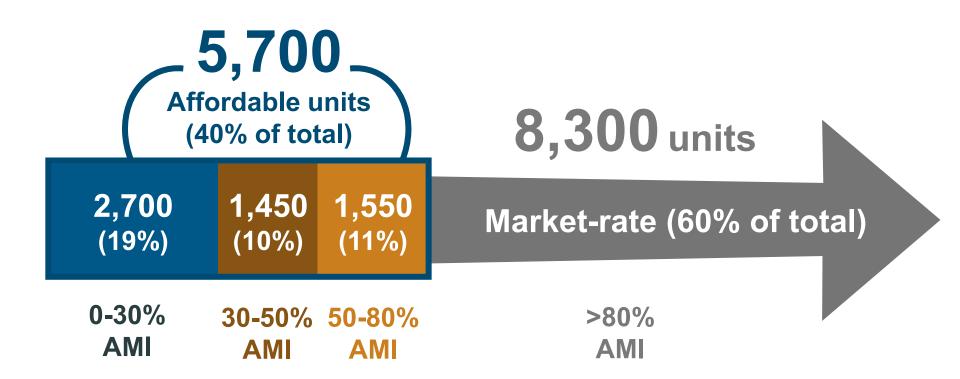
- +35K total housing unit growth (2019-2044)
- +14K added units,
 2024-2034
- Affordable units based on 2022 Bellevue Housing Needs Assessment (HNA)
- 10-Year Timeframe
- Focus on <80% AMI

Intent of Target

- Evaluate effectiveness of current programs
- Identify tools and resources to meet the goal
- Guide implementation of CPPU and AHS

Affordable Housing Metrics



- ✓ Area Median Income (AMI) levels
- Tenure (Renter occupied, Owner occupied)
- New construction or preservation
- Family-sized units (3+ bedrooms)
- Geographic distribution
- Emergency housing (in addition to housing target)
