## Mid Biennium Overview

Required by RCW to adjust for known fiscal condition updates mid way through the 2-year budget.

#### **Mid-Biennium Overview**

- Continues the Council direction from Adopted Budget including
  - 1% Property Tax Adjustment for 2024
  - Critical Investments for Growth
- Updates revenues for current fiscal knowledge
- Expenditures that impact most funds
  - Inflation 6.5% impacts personnel and others expenditures.

## **2023 Property Tax:**

2023 \$1M AV home pays ~\$8,841

2024 1% Adjustment = ~\$9 for \$1M Home

King County 19%



Bellevue School District 28%



State of Washington 33%

## Mid-Biennium Highlights

#### General Fund:

- Updated revenues
- Technical and other items (primarily personnel)
- Biennium funding for Keep Bellevue Beautiful Program
- Funding for Homelessness Program Support pilot and evaluation

#### Other Funds:

- CIP: Affordable Housing Permit & Fee Reduction Project
- Hotel/Motel: Added funding for TPA revenues
- Utilities: Rate relief subsidy & Donation Program

## **General Fund Forecast**


A financial forecast is an estimate of financial future. It is based on best information today. Its purpose is to provide out year fiscal information that assists in informing financial decisions.

## **Forecast Takeaways**


- Development cooling after historic highs
  - Hybrid work and higher interest rates impacting near-term growth
- Bellevue amenities continue to retain and attract businesses
- Sales Tax and B&O Taxes projected to average
  5 percent growth
- Inflation is expected to decrease gradually to historical averages by the mid-to-late 2020s


#### Forecasted Revenues & Expenditures (2023-2028)




# General Fund Planning (2025-2028)




## **Managing Structural Deficits**
