PHASE 1 - DISCOVER



Introduction

Bellevue is known for its diverse, vibrant, and welcoming neighborhoods. The high quality of life that community members enjoy isn't an accident; it's a result of careful planning done with the input the people who live, work, and play here.

The **Great Neighborhoods** program is the process for developing neighborhood area plans that reflect the community's values and vision for the future. These provide guidance to the city, developers, and community partners about how people want to see the neighborhood evolve in the future.

Neighborhood area plans are part of the city's Comprehensive Plan (Volume 2). They help address the changing needs of specific areas while staying aligned with the city's overall vision and policies (Volume 1).

Project Scope

As part of the Great Neighborhoods program, City Council initiated updates to the neighborhood area plans for Crossroads and Newport in September 2024. This process will repeat in cycles until all sixteen neighborhood area plans have been updated.

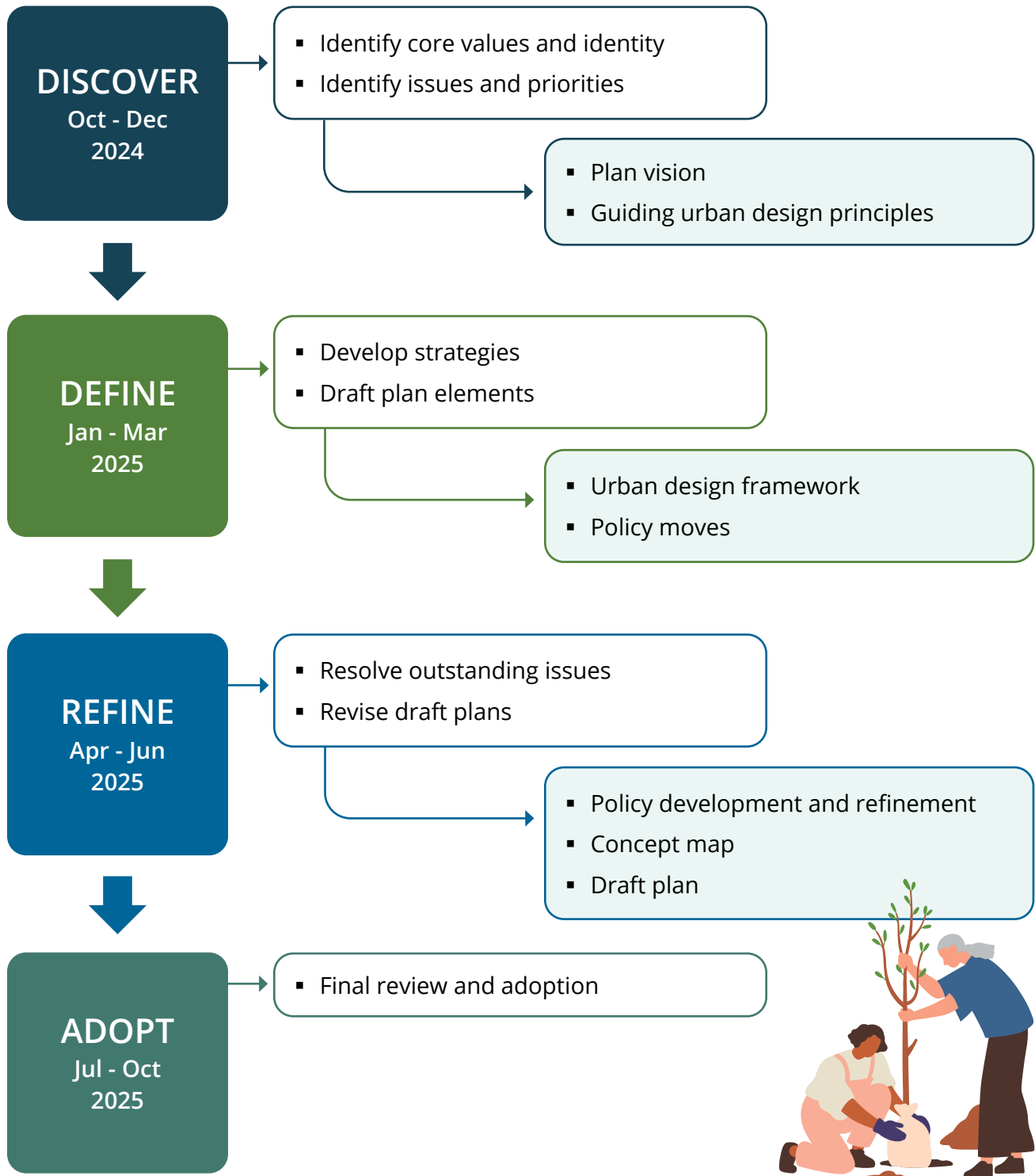
The goal is to adopt plans that are relevant to each neighborhood's unique identity, opportunities, and challenges. This planning effort seeks to enhance livability and is focused on the following topics:

- **Neighborhood Identity:** Define the unique aspects of each neighborhood and develop strategies to highlight them.
- **Enhanced Community Gathering Spaces:** Define and strengthen community hubs and "third places" that foster social interaction and connectivity.
- **Urban Design Framework:** Establish guidance on neighborhood design, focusing on opportunities to activate spaces and improve the look and feel of public spaces.
- **Neighborhood Connectivity:** Make it safe and convenient for people to get around their neighborhood, connect to transit and use other modes of transportation.
- **Public Realm Improvements:** Identify needs for potential future improvements, such as streets and trails, through community engagement.



Project Timeline

The planning process is rooted in extensive community engagement that seeks to involve the many diverse voices that make up each neighborhood. The work is broken down into four phases with many opportunities for community members to provide input and review draft policy ideas.



Overview of Outreach Activities & Participation

The Discover phase of neighborhood area planning began in October and went through December of 2024. As suggested by the name, engagement was focused on learning and discovery. Goals included setting expectations around the scope and timeline; understanding how the community sees itself; identifying neighborhood assets and opportunities for improving public spaces, gathering places, and neighborhood connectivity.

Support for Equitable Engagement

Crossroads is one of Bellevue’s most diverse neighborhoods. 59% of residents are from communities of color, 13% are 65 or older, and 70% of residents are renters. Ensuring these voices are part of the neighborhood planning process is a priority for the City. The planning team took a number of steps to connect with diverse communities including meeting with Spanish language parents’ groups; initiating a collaboration with King County Housing Authority’s property managers, presenting to a Chinese seniors’ group; posting flyers at apartment buildings, presenting to residents at Silver Glen, a 55 and older community; and connecting with 8th graders at Odle Middle school. Bellevue’s Cultural Outreach team provided critical support by leading presentations in other languages and promoting engagement opportunities via different channels.



Outreach activities during this phase included

- 1 Virtual Kickoff Event (combined with Newport)
- 14 meetings with neighborhood leaders
- 5 presentations to neighborhood groups
- 6 pop-up tabling opportunities at community events
- 1 Ideas Fair (in-person)

During this phase the planning team connected with

- 395 people in-person at our community events, pop-up tabling, small-group meetings, and presentations.
- 169 people who responded to the mailed or online questionnaire.
- 166 visitors to our online engagement hub

Demographics

Reporting on demographic information of participants can be challenging. There are some events, like a drop-in event, where the format doesn't allow for easy data collection. Additionally, demographic questions are always optional, and some people decline to share personal details.

The online questionnaire provided the most structured opportunity for collecting demographic data, which allows staff to understand how participation aligns with city-wide demographics. In general, there are significant gaps in participation from people of color, renters, and over-representation from older residents.

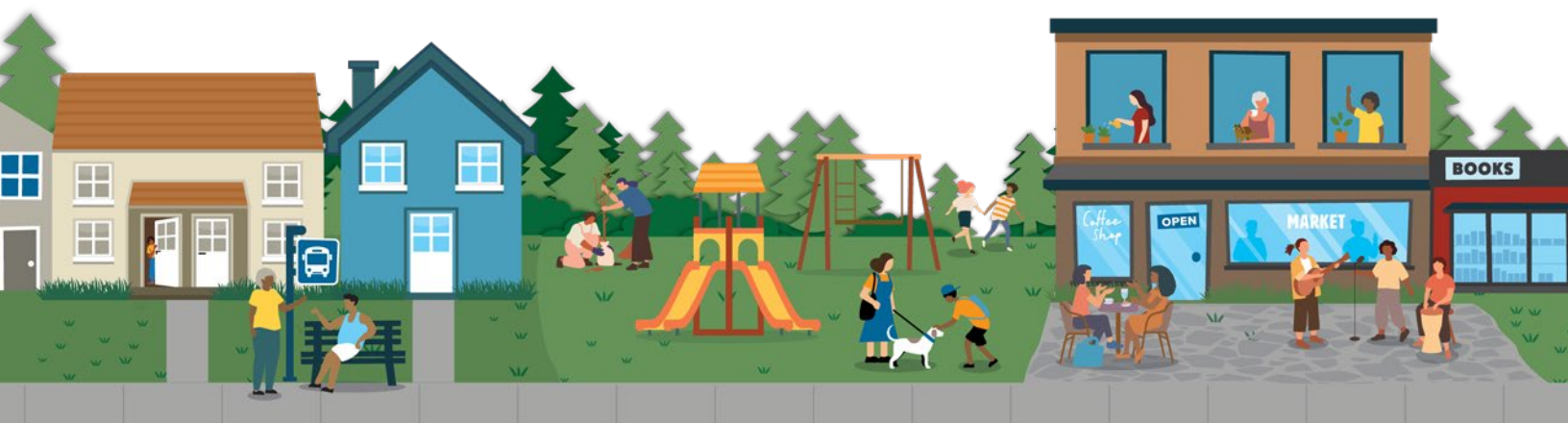
People Ages 45+

Summary of Input

The primary purpose of the Discover phase is right in the name – it's a time for the planning team to learn how the community sees itself. What are shared values, ideas for the futures, challenges that need to be addressed and opportunities to enhance livability. Questions and topic areas that framed the conversation included:

- What are the core values that should inform future development and changes?
- How can neighborhood connectivity be enhanced and make it easier for people to walk, bike, or take transit to destinations in their neighborhood and beyond?
- What are some of the places and spaces that people enjoy spending time in in the neighborhood?
- Where do people like to gather with friends and family in the neighborhood?
- What qualities do people want to see more of in public spaces in the neighborhood?
- What are specific challenges or opportunities that need to be addressed?

Values & Vision

Understanding community values is a key part of the planning process. Values are an expression of what is most important to the community – what they take pride in and what they aspire to be. Values lead to a vision of what the community wants to achieve in the future. The values and vision also serve as a touchstone in the development of policies reminding planners what actions and outcomes the policies should support.

During both the Kickoff Event and Ideas Fair, participants were invited to share their value in a simple card sorting exercise. The planning team also use a Mad-Libs type exercise to invite people to apply those values to a sample Vision Statement. Participants also shared their values during small group discussions and meetings.

Community members in Crossroads value the neighborhood's **convenience** and **diversity**. People appreciate that it's easy to access services and amenities like the mall and the community center, and to access Downtown and other neighborhoods. Participants expressed a desire for more **play & creativity** and **sustainability** both in increased access to green space and support for more biking and walking and access to transit.

Neighborhood Identity & Assets

Understanding how the neighborhood sees itself – what qualities make it unique – was a key question for this phase of engagement. The policies in the neighborhood area plan should strengthen and enhance things that make a neighborhood special and beloved by the people who live, work, and play there.

People were invited to share what they like and appreciate about their neighborhood during small group discussions, via exercises during the Ideas Fair, and questions on the mailed questionnaire.

Peaceful, green, and busy/congested

were the qualities that respondents to the mailed questionnaire brought up most when asked to describe Crossroads in three words. Crossroads is known for its **diversity** and that contributes to its **family-oriented** and **inclusive** feeling. It's a centrally located neighborhood and with lots of **access** to community centers, parks, shopping as well as other destinations like Downtown and the growing BelRed arts district.

In speaking about specific locations or amenities, people most often brought up Crossroads Mall, which one questionnaire respondent described as, "one of the best Third Places in all of Seattle. It's great having the DMV, library, and Police there too. It's nice having all we need to shop for in one place but also have live entertainment and community events there."

Crossroads Park is another important community asset. It provides a variety of "facilities for small and large gatherings" while offering different recreation opportunities in a safe environment.

Several respondents mentioned locations and amenities outside of the neighborhood like Robinswood Park, the YMCA on Bel-Red Road, and the Bellevue Botanical Gardens, which further highlights how Crossroads' central location makes it easy for people to connect to places outside of their neighborhood.

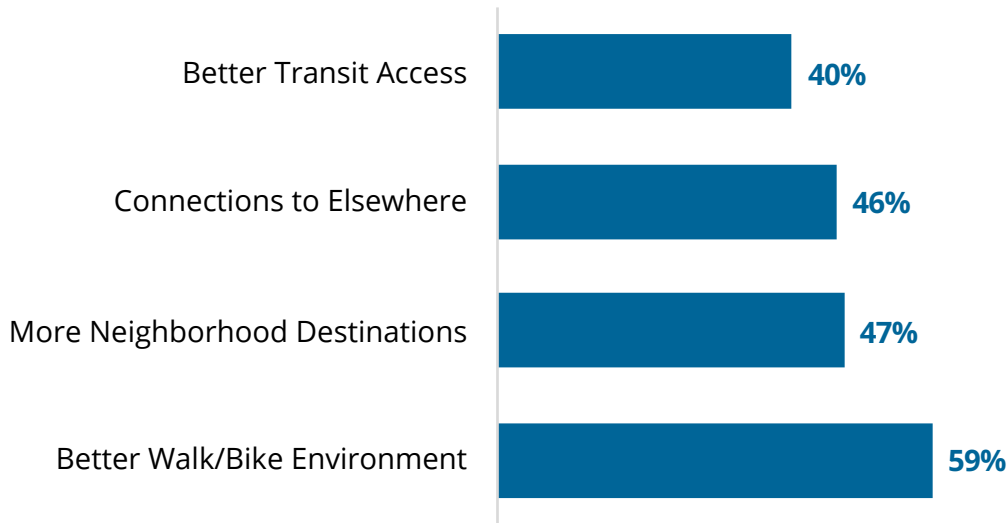
Neighborhood Connectivity

Improving people's ability to walk, bike, and roll in the neighborhood is an important focus area for neighborhood area planning. The Great Neighborhoods project also seeks to look for opportunities to improve access to transit and connections within the neighborhood and to other destinations. Connectivity is an important issue for community members. People provided a lot of feedback related to walkability, pedestrian safety, options for biking, and access to neighborhood amenities.

When asked, "What would encourage you to walk, bike, roll, and/or use transit more?" community members indicated that a better walking and biking environment would be the most impactful. More destinations within the neighborhood and connections to other places were also important.

People in Crossroads most often mention the **pathways** in **Crossroads Community Park** and nearby **Kelsey Creek Park** as paths they value. The community values these pathways as they provide an opportunity to exercise in a pleasant, green setting as well as safe pedestrian connections to a range of destinations. Other commonly mentioned paths are the “**cut-through**” **neighborhood trails** providing direct pedestrian connections for community members without having to walk or bike along arterial roads. Examples are the

trail connecting Bel-Red Road and Chevy Chase, the path between Crossroads Community Park and Northup Way, and the various trails connecting neighborhoods schools with the surrounding neighborhoods. People also valued several long-distance trails running near Crossroads, like the **Lake to Lake Trail** and **SR 520 Trail**.

People shared concerns about the pedestrian experience on Crossroads’ arterials, as these roads are often busy with vehicular traffic, and the lack of infrastructure supporting walking and biking. At the same time, people value 156th Ave NE and NE 8th Street for their vibrancy and for providing access to local businesses and transit.

Neighborhood Gathering Places

Having a variety of neighborhood gathering places and “third places,” like coffee shops or bookstores is an important part of livability. They help strengthen social connections between community members by providing opportunities for recreation, celebrations, pursuing hobbies, and connecting with friends.

The places in Crossroads that people value the most are the Crossroads Mall and Crossroads Community Park. People like the **Crossroads Mall** for its variety of shops and restaurants and because it serves as a community gathering space, especially the food court and library. People see live music events and other entertainment as key in the mall serving as a community gathering space, as well as being able to socialize without having to spend money. However, several people point out they want to see cheaper food options at the mall and the space

needing an update and adding more daylight. People enjoy the variety of **restaurants and food trucks** available throughout Crossroads. People mention the need for more indoor community gathering spaces other than the mall and **community centers** available to them in Crossroads.

The community values **Crossroads Community Park** because it has something to offer for everyone, like the dog park, walking trails, community events, and a golf course. Other community gathering spaces that are often mentioned are the **trails** providing access to **neighborhood schools** and **natural areas**. People also point out the importance of gathering with neighbors in their **houses** and yards and on **residential streets**.

Outside of the neighborhood, people mentioned visiting **Bellevue Botanical Garden** and nearby parks such as **Kelsey Creek Park**.

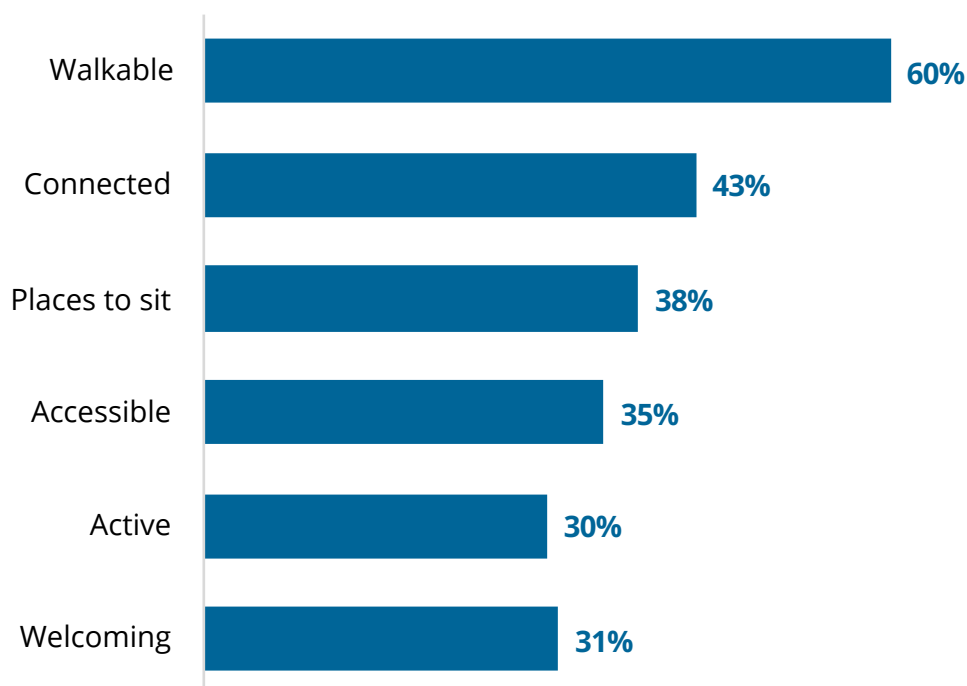
Neighborhood Challenges & Opportunities

During the Discover phase the planning team sought to identify key challenges and opportunities. This information helped to identify both specific locations for urban design and public realm improvements and opportunities for creating policies that will support overall livability.

To begin with, the planning team invited people to share what overall qualities people wanted to see more of in the neighborhood. Through dot voting exercises and tabling events and in a question on the survey people could choose from a variety of attributes.

The top qualities people in Crossroads would like to see more of are:

Residents want their communities to be more walkable



At the in-person Ideas Fair and during small group discussions and presentations, people also raised a number of concerns and ideas for improvement including:

- **Pedestrian safety** – People identified the need to add crosswalks to improve pedestrian safety on currently uninterrupted stretches of arterials, mainly on 148th Ave NE and 164th Ave NE, and at the intersection of Bel-Red Road, NE 20th Street and 152nd Ave NE.
- **Active transportation access** – People mostly pointed to 156th Ave NE as needing active transportation (pedestrian and bicycle) facilities, including adding a sidewalk on NE 13th Place, as well as creating a bike connection to Downtown along BelRed.
- **Through-block pedestrian connections** – People identified the need to create more pedestrian trails within Crossroads' superblocks to destinations like the Crossroads Mall and to provide public access to neighborhood schools and their sports facilities.
- **Community gathering spaces** – People expressed a desire to expand programming in parks and community centers and to enhance community gathering spaces in (mixed-use) commercial areas, specifically the Crossroads Mall and in nearby BelRed, including through providing more cultural attractions.
- **Opportunities for new parks and open spaces** – People identified the southeastern portion of Bellevue School District's Highland Middle School and privately-owned Chevy Chase Neighborhood Park as potential future city parks open to the public.
- **Pedestrian experience** – People saw opportunities for improving the pedestrian experience
- **Wayfinding** – People said that they want to see improved wayfinding – also through signage in languages other than English – to increase awareness of nearby (urban) trails and access to natural areas in and around Crossroads.

How this input will be used

Unique elements contributing to the neighborhood's identity and top values identified by community members during the **Discover Phase** will inform the Neighborhood Vision drafted during the **Define Phase** of the planning process. Key challenges and opportunities identified by the community through our past engagement activities will inform priority policy areas that will be developed during the Define Phase. These policy areas, and eventually the actual policies, will be shared with the community for their review and further input.



Opportunities, challenges, and ideas from the **Discover Phase** will also be explored through the development of the urban design framework. The city will conduct pop-up neighborhood walks and workshops during the **Define Phase** of engagement to help community members evaluate public spaces within their neighborhood and document where new urban design opportunities may exist. This evaluation will supplement and provide context for the neighborhood area plans and will contribute to the refinement of policies in the two plans.
