Public Engagement During Council Deliberations

Second Public Hearing

The City of Bellevue conducts three public hearings as part of its budget process. The first was held on July 9, 2024, to inform staff's development of the Preliminary Budget, with the second and third public hearings occurring during Council's deliberation period after the Preliminary Budget was transmitted to Council by the City Manager. During the public hearing, nearly 20 community members shared the priorities they would like to see funded including environmental stewardship, road safety, transit access, pedestrian/bicycle infrastructure and more.

Community Information Sessions

Staff held three information sessions with the public to orient Bellevue's communities with the Preliminary Budget and CIP Plan. Staff provided insights on how each Strategic Target Area would be impacted and how these investments as well as ongoing operations and projects would be funded. This high-level information was published in seven (including English) languages and the staff presentation was published on the Bellevue Television YouTube page to ensure the broadest outreach and sharing.

At each of these information sessions attendees were welcomed to provide written feedback on postcards or online. In total, staff received four responses with feedback to invest further in sidewalks and artistic endeavors.

Memory Bank Themes

Since the introduction of the Preliminary Budget on September 17, staff have cataloged and answered more than 112 questions from Council in the Memory Bank. These questions and answers have been posted regularly in agenda materials throughout the process. The questions and answers fit in the broad themes below.

POLICY & FISCAL IMPACTS

Policy Impact

RCW 35A.34 – Biennial Budgets: State law specifies requirements that must be followed in budgeting each of the City's funds. Key areas covered include:

- Preparation and filing of a preliminary budget by the Chief Administrative Officer, i.e., City Manager;
- A budget message: from the Chief Administrative Officer explaining the content, financial policies and major proposed changes;
- A public hearing on the proposed preliminary budget conducted before adoption of a final budget, which shall be held on or before the first Monday in December;
- Balanced expenditures and revenue estimates for each of the City's funds;
- Council adoption of the budget prior to the beginning of the ensuing fiscal biennium, i.e., January 1, 2023.
