





# **2025 Property Tax Distribution**

\$1.19M home pays \$0.98 per \$1000 AV to the City of Bellevue representing 12% of the total property tax bill.

1% increase would reflect a \$11.66 increase in 2025

- Operating Reserves
- Capital and Replacement Reserves
- Compensation and Risk Reserves
- Planning Reserves
- Development Services Reserves

# Financial Plan Understanding

- Reduction in Appropriation and Revenues
  - Appropriation of Expenditures, but not Reserves or Fund Balance
  - Large one-time revenues TIFIA receipts and Federal grants
  - Removal of reserves and indirect allocations
- Funds
  - Expenditures aligned with revenue sources without transfers
  - Expenditures aggregated in clear places
- Capital Improvement Program Plans
  - Staffing for Capital moved from Operating


- Council direction to implement received June 11

- Contingent positions for quick response

# Financial Management Guiding Principles

- Funding structure should support DS line of business through economic cycles
- Permit applicants should pay for services received
- Fees should be predictable and understandable to customer
- Fees should be regionally competitive



# **Proposed Fees & Rates**

### **Proposed Fee Adjustments**

- Update hourly rates and adjust flat fees
- Update building valuation table to 2024 and apply Washington State modifier
- Adjust building permit fees by CPI-W (3.49%)



# **Proposed Hourly Rates**

Function	2024 Adopted	2025 Proposed	% change in rate
Land Use review	\$272	\$281	3.31%
Fire review & inspection	\$200	\$212	6.00%
Transportation review & inspection	\$225	\$243	8.00%
Utilities review & inspection	\$187	\$197	5.35%



# **School Impact Fee Update**

- Charged by Issaquah and Renton School Districts per BCC 22.18
- A pass-through fee applied to new residential construction located within districts. Formula is set in BCC 22.18.090
- Used to support capital programs
- Fee is collected by Bellevue at building permit and transferred to school districts




Issaquah School District – planned high school

#### **District Boundaries**

- Bellevue is served by four school districts:
  - Bellevue School District (BSD)
  - Lake Washington School District (LWSD)
  - Issaquah School District (ISD)
  - Renton School District (RSD)



# **2025 School Impact Fees**

#### **Issaquah School District**

- Single-family impact fee is \$4,728 (- \$10,782)
- Multi-family impact fee is \$0 (- \$3,514)

#### **Renton School District**

- Single-family impact fee is \$1,003 (- \$1,158)
- Multi-family impact fee is \$3,268 (- \$989)
