Introduced in early 2023

- Amends Local Project Review Act (RCW 36.70B)
- Land Use and environmental permits
- Goal to create efficiencies and streamline permitting
- Mandatory permit review timelines
- Penalties requiring refunding of fees

Signed by Governor May 8, 2023

- Effective summer 2023 and beyond
- Department of Commerce lead role

Community Assistance Plan to Address Residential Permit Delays

Commerce Update



- 1. Developing guidance
 - Digital permitting work group
- 2. First deliverable legislative report
 - Plan for trained staff to review residential permits
 - Key findings staffing challenges, backlog, planning workload
- 3. Commerce recommendations
 - Resource strategies and consultant resource list
- 4. Future deliverables

Key Components – Procedural and Administrative

- Prohibits site plan review on interior alterations
- Requires clear submittal requirements
- Amends definition of project permit
- Amends requirements for permit application completeness
- Publish performance reports at local and state level



Key Components – Policy Considerations

- Previous project permit shot clocks
 - 120 days for project permits with exceptions
- New project permit default shot clocks
 - 65 days when a public notice is <u>not</u> required
 - 100 days when a public notice is required
 - 170 days when public notice and public hearing required
- Fee refund penalty for not meeting shot clocks
- Adopt 3 streamlining measures to avoid fee refunds

65 Days – No Public Notice	217	79%	
100 Days – Public Notice	139	29%	
170 Days – Public Hearing	2	0%	
All Project Permits	358	59%	

Findings

- Resource availability is a key component
- Special circumstances and complexity factors
- Framework based on public process only
- Factors outside of city control and unintended consequences
- Alignment with current process improvement efforts

Timeline Analysis

Permit Types with Special Circumstances			
Permit Type	City Median Timeline Calendar Days	Applicant Median Timeline Calendar Days	
Design Reviews	456	119	
Master Development Plans	421	172	
Critical Areas Land Use Permits	173	184	
Shoreline Substantial Development	138	209	

Recommendation

- Move 4 of 24 permit types to 170-day bucket based on:
 - Special circumstances and complexity factors
 - Size and scope of large development projects
 - Permits with complex environmental conditions
 - Conditions outside of city control

Example Development Proposals

Major Projects

- Phased development
- Multiple high-rise towers
- Highly complex design

Projects in Sensitive Areas

- Wetlands/streams/shorelines
- Site-specific conditions
- Procedural complexities





Streamlining Measures

Background

- RCW 36.70B.160 provides 10 measures
- Implement three measures and avoid fee refunds
- Five-year performance evaluation

Recommend Implementing 3 Measures

- Reasonable fees per RCW 82.02.020
- Consultant contracts and supporting budget
- Budget contingent positions for quick response


