EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ACTION

Staff requests action from Council on the Arts Commission's recommended funding allocations for 2025-2026 Capital Projects and Facility Maintenance grants in the Art and Cultural Facility Grants Program.

RECOMMENDATION

Move to approve the Arts Commission recommendations for 2025-2026 Capital Projects and Facility Maintenance grants in the Art and Cultural Facility Grants Program.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

In July 2024, the City Council approved the Arts and Cultural Facility Grant Program through Ordinance No. 6790, establishing Chapter 4.45 in BCC. This program was created to formalize and expand the City's support for arts and cultural facilities through a structured and equitable competitive grantmaking process. The program aims to support both existing and emerging arts and culture organizations with capital and maintenance needs.

Grant Application and Allocation Process

The total available budget for the 2025-2026 grant cycle was \$1,800,000. The grant opportunity opened for applications on July 10. Staff hosted two information sessions and provided professional grant writing support through an independent contractor which was available free of charge to any qualifying applicants. Facility grants were offered for various projects that fell into two main categories: capital and maintenance.

- Capital Projects: These include property acquisition, new facility construction, acquisition of specialized equipment, and major building renovations. Applicants can apply again in future years with the same or different projects.
- **Facility Maintenance**: This one-time grant covers preventative maintenance and repairs to preserve existing arts and cultural facilities.

Award recommendations were developed through an in-depth application process administered by Arts Program staff and evaluated by an Allocations Committee appointed by the Arts Commission. The Allocations Committee, consisting of two Arts Commissioners and two arts & cultural facility professionals, met on September 3 and reviewed all applications and cumulative scores to develop their final funding recommendations.

2025-2026 Funding Recommendations

The City of Bellevue received a total of \$22,703,498 in requests from five applicants across seven total applications. The Allocations Committee has recommended allocating a total of \$1,800,000 to four applicants across five applications as follows in ranked order. These grants have the ability to impact 90,453 square feet of art and cultural spaces across Bellevue, from Downtown to BelRed, Lake Hills and Eastgate. A summary is provided in Table 1, and detailed descriptions of each project are provided in Attachment A.

POLICY & FISCAL IMPACTS

Policy Impact
