



### **Economic Prosperity & Partnership**

- State and federal decisions affect economy, city services, and affordability.
- Request to be a consulted partner to economic and policy shifts.
- Bellevue will evaluate proposals through fiscal sustainability and economic prosperity lens.
  - Policies that foster fair business competition, drive innovation, and attract and retain talent.
  - Prioritize stable, sustainable revenue sources that minimize impacts.



# Key Priorities: Housing, Permitting

#### Affordable Housing

Provide adequate funding, resources, and time necessary to implement recent state land use and housing legislation.

Support flexible funding options for local jurisdictions that address affordable housing.

#### **Streamlined Permitting**

Consistent permitting across jurisdictional boundaries is critical to supporting local economies, housing, environmental protection and trust in local government.

Support the eCityGov Alliance funding request to modernize *MyBuildingPermit.com*.

# **Key Priorities: Transportation**

#### I-405/SR 167 Corridor (WSDOT)

Support improvements that maximize the effectiveness of the 50-mile Express Toll Lane system, including the Renton to Bellevue Contract 3 project

#### **Business Access and Transit (BAT) Lanes**

Support policy that allows employer shuttles to use BAT lanes along with transit buses.

#### SR 520/124th Avenue NE Interchange (WSDOT)

Support funding for construction for interchange, fish passage, and multimodal realignment

#### **Appreciation for supporting Grand Connection Crossing**

# Staff Proposed Amendment

#### **Economic Prosperity & Partnership**

Add to the end of the first paragraph:

Bellevue may not be able to support tax proposals that could create a direct impact on Bellevue's employment base and that would give Washington a competitive disadvantage in a competitive marketplace.
