

Bicycle Projects

Three sources of "bicycle" projects in the Candidate Project list

- Referrals from Bike Bellevue (13 projects on list, 8 for TFP process)
- MIP "Gap" projects (11 projects)
- Projects from current 2022-2033 TFP (~8 projects)*

*Projects often address multiple modes, so what to count as a "bicycle" project is somewhat subjective. There are additional projects that address pedestrian AND bicycle needs.



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Bicycle Project Implementation

Two primary ways bicycle projects are advanced to implementation:

- Major capital project (e.g., MTSG Trail, West Lake Sammamish Pkwy)
- Ongoing programs and area investments. These include W/B-85 Bicycle Network Facilities

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TFP-300	Growth Corridor B icycle Network <u>Facilities</u>	W/B-85	Design and implement bicycle facility improvements in the Downtown, BelRed, and Wilburton neighborhood urban core areas and citywide to complete gaps in the Priority Bicycle Corridors and at other locations on that provide residents, employees, and families with equitable access to the area's key destinations. Consistent with the planned Bicycle Network: eExamples of potential project locations include 100th Avenue NE, 106th Avenue NE, NE 1st and 2nd Streets, 116th Avenue NE, 120th Avenue NE, 140th Avenue NE, Bel-Red Rd, and Northup Way and others as may be determined through analsysis and public process. Funding is an initial allocation for project development and early implementation.	Ricycle	This is an ongoing CIP program; 2025-2030 CIP expanded geographic scope to entire city.

Other examples are the Transportation Levy (CIP R-199) and Downtown Transportation Plan implementation (CIP R-182).












136th to 140th Ave: Additional or Alternative Option

Missing: East-West connection to Crossroads and Overlake




