Whereas: Hindu Americans represent diverse ethnic backgrounds, including

individuals of Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi, Malaysian, Indonesian,

Afghani, Nepali, Bhutanese, Sri Lankan, Fijian, Caribbean and

European descent; and

Whereas: Our city and nation have greatly benefited from Hindu Americans,

including through the Vedanta philosophy, Ayurvedic medicine, classical Indian art, dance, music, meditation, yoga, literature,

community service and more; and

Whereas: October holds significance as the birth month of Mahatma Gandhi and

the time for major Hindu holidays such as Navaratri and Diwali; and

**Whereas:** Many Hindu Americans are immigrants, some coming as students in

search of better economic opportunities or to unite with family members, while others arrive after facing oppression; and

**Whereas:** Despite their positive contributions, Hindu Americans face stereotypes

and misconceptions about their heritage and have been the targets of

bullying, discrimination, hate speech and bias-motivated crimes.
