Whereas: August is recognized nationally as Black Business Month, a time to honor and celebrate

the contributions of Black-owned businesses and entrepreneurs whose innovation, leadership and resilience strengthen local economies and communities across the

country; and

Whereas: Black-owned businesses are an essential part of Bellevue's vibrant and diverse economy,

enriching the city's culture, creating jobs and serving as engines of opportunity and

equity; and

Whereas: despite persistent disparities in access to capital, resources and market opportunities,

Black entrepreneurs continue to build successful businesses and demonstrate

extraordinary resilience and leadership; and

Whereas: the City of Bellevue is committed to advancing racial equity and economic inclusion, and

recognizes that supporting Black-owned businesses is critical to fostering a thriving and

equitable community; and

Whereas: organizations and initiatives throughout Bellevue — including local chambers, economic

development programs and community partners — are working to support Black-owned businesses through access to funding, technical assistance, mentorship and visibility; and

Whereas: celebrating Black Business Month provides an opportunity to elevate the voices, stories

and impact of Black entrepreneurs and to encourage residents, institutions and

businesses to support Black-owned enterprises year-round.

Now, therefore, I, Lynne Robinson, Mayor of the City of Bellevue, Washington, and on behalf of the City Council, do hereby proclaim **August 2025** as:

Black Business Month

in Bellevue, Washington, and encourage all residents to support Black-owned businesses, celebrate their contributions to our community, and work toward a more inclusive and equitable economy for all.
