EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ACTION

Adopt the Ordinance relating to the parking of vehicles, establishing time-restricted parking along the east and west sides of 130th Ave NE between NE Spring Blvd and NE 20th St. Time limits may vary from 3-minute parking to 4-hour parking and the hours of daily restrictions may be in effect as early as 7 a.m. to as late as 8 p.m.

RECOMMENDATION

Move to adopt Ordinance No. 6872

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

In anticipation of East Link Light Rail, the City Council in 2009 adopted a new subarea plan and land use code for the BelRed area. The plan outlined a transformation of the former industrial area into a series of vibrant, urban villages with abundant new green space, businesses and homes.

One of the first major BelRed area redevelopment projects was the 130th Ave NE Corridor project. This project redeveloped 130th Avenue NE, from Bel-Red Road to NE 20th Street. It's one of several transportation investments in the BelRed areas that will improve mobility for people who walk, roll, take transit, drive and move freight. The project was designed in coordination with Sound Transit's East Link light rail alignment, which crosses 130th Avenue along Spring Boulevard; it includes the BelRed-130th Station. This corridor project was completed earlier this year.

Establishing time-restricted parking creates daytime turnover in parking spaces and short-term loading zones for retail customers. Additionally, time restrictions discourage the use of on-street public parking for commuters or construction workers in accordance with the BelRed Subarea Plan.
