

- Snow Response Project Team

 - Parks (Lead – Civic buildings)
 - FAM (Lead – Fleet Maintenance)
 - Utilities (Lead - Flooding)
 - CMO (Lead – Communications)




Last Winter's Storm

- La Niña weather pattern followed predication
- Multiple smaller snow events




Implementation of snow and ice response dispatching application

- Real time monitoring of deployed vehicles throughout the city
- Visual status of elapsed time between route servicing
- Flagging for roadway hazards
- Improved communications between dispatch and field crews



Implementation of snow and ice response dispatching application

- 24 vehicle mounted tablets
- Turn-by-turn navigation for assigned routes
- Serviced arterials change color as they are completed
- Photos of road conditions can be pushed to dispatch staff
