

October 2024 Enrollment


BSD enrollment grew for the second year in a row despite enrollment declines experienced by other districts throughout King County.

There are 922 more students in our school buildings this year compared to the October 2022.



Enrollment by Grade Cohort


The lower grade cohorts are still smaller than the upper grade cohorts. However, the lower grade cohorts are growing when compared to last year's grade level cohorts which are the black bars in the graph. The only grades below high school where the cohort is not larger this year than last were 3rd grade and 5th grade. However, when looking at the cohorts that moved up you can see growth in all grades except 11th and 12th grades. The growth in the lower grade levels will help stabilize district enrollment in the upper grade levels in coming years.

2024/25 October Enrollment






BSD elementary school enrollment has stabilized. Elementary schools added 223 students between fall 2023 and this year fueled by multilingual opportunities and non-resident students. There are only 3 schools with less than 400 students and only one school with more than 600 students. The remaining 12 elementary schools are between 450 and 565 students which leaves room for some additional growth but allows the district to provide a greater level of services to students.

Middle School Enrollment

Greater numbers of out of district students at middle school has stabilized middle school enrollment throughout the district. Highland, Chinook and Tillicum each have 40+ students from other districts while Tyee has 128 out of district students. Tyee enrollment had been dropping with smaller grade cohorts at 6th grade. Out of district students have resulted in relatively equal sized grade cohorts at Tyee which helps to stabilize staffing and scheduling.



Out of District Student Enrollment


Out of district student enrollment has been growing as a percent of total enrollment for the past 5-years with the most significant growth in the last 2 years. Children of district employees have remained relatively flat for the past four years with the growth coming from other out of district enrollment. The largest percent change in out of district enrollment in the past 5-years has been at middle schools with a total growth for that period being 125%. Elementary and high schools have seen growth rates of out of district students in the same period of 71% and 79% respectively. The district's goal with respect to out of district enrollment is to stabilize enrollment at all levels - elementary, middle school, and high school.






Impact of Out of District Students

Without out of district students, total enrollment would be just above 18,000 students, slightly higher than last year's in district enrollment of 17,859. However, the district would still be experiencing lower enrollment at both elementary and middle schools with 515 fewer students at elementary schools which is equivalent to an entire elementary school and 326 fewer students at middle schools which is about the size of ½ a middle school. Middle school enrollment would have declined from a high of 4,662 in-district students in 2020/2021 to 4,236 in-district students this school year.




Legislative Spending—Funds Subject to Outlook

GAPS IN STATE FUNDING






Since 2020, BSD has been underfunded for Special Education by \$133.5 Million.




