ORDINANCE NO. 6798

AN ORDINANCE 1) authorizing execution of a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) to accept up to \$1,426,531 in federal Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) funding to support implementation of the Real-time Traffic Signal Safety Intervention (RTSSI) Project; and 2) amending the 2023-2029 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Plan to increase the budget for the Smart Mobility Plan Implementation Program (CIP Plan No. PW-R-156) by \$1,426,531.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) to accept up to \$1,426,531 in federal Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) funding to support implementation of the Real-time Traffic Signal Safety Intervention (RTSSI) Project, a copy of which grant agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said Grant Agreement and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 3. The 2023-2029 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Plan adopted by Ordinance No. 6698 on November 21, 2022, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the budget for the Smart Mobility Plan Implementation Program (CIP Plan No. PW-R-156) by \$1,426,531.

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in said Grant Agreement shall be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
