# Corridors Bellevue Bike



## Bike Bellevue Funding

## \$4.5 million in the 2023-29 CIP.

- Design and implement rapid-build bicycle projects on existing streets in the Downtown, Wilburton, and BelRed neighborhoods.
- "Early implementation" corridors cost estimate
  - \$3,530,000 (final design and construction may end up being different than this preliminary cost estimate)

## Council Direction to Transportation Commission

## Develop a recommendation for each proposed corridor consistent with the following categories:

- 1) Corridors that would not require travel lane repurposing that the City would program and implement as soon as possible.
- 2) Corridors that have an emphasis on creating connected routes for Bike Bellevue.
- 3) If a travel lane is recommended to be repurposed, it will be first evaluated as a trial or demonstration project that will be evaluated using data that will be provided by the Transportation Commission and recommend to repurpose a travel lane only as a last resort.
- 4) Prioritize high injury network area corridors.
- 5) Corridors that would be deferred to and incorporated into the next update of the Transportation Facilities Plan (2024/25) for citywide consideration, prioritization, and resource allocation.
- 6) Corridors that would no longer be considered and provide a rationale as to why.
- 7) Corridors that would be implemented as permanent bicycle infrastructure rather than with a rapid-implementation design.

## **Transportation Commission** Recommendation: April 11

**Category 1.** Corridors that would not require travel lane repurposing that the City would program and implement as soon as possible.

## Transportation Commission Recommendation: May 23

#### Category 6.

Corridors that would no longer be considered (as designed in Bike Bellevue) and provide a rationale as to why.

Corridor 6A. Shared lane markings, traffic calming, wayfinding, reduce speed limit to 20 mph, evaluation.

## Transportation Commission Recommendation: June 13


#### Category 7.

Corridors that would be implemented as permanent bicycle infrastructure rather than with a rapid-implementation design.

Multipurpose path back of curb on the north side of NE 12<sup>th</sup> Street

100th Ave NE – 108th Avenue NE

Coordinate design and construction with private redevelopment west of 102<sup>nd</sup>
Avenue NE





## Corridor 1: Northup Way



#### **Bike Bellevue:**

Reallocate one westbound lane to provide one-way separated buffered bike lanes on both sides.

#### **Ped-Bike Plan:**

B-111-N/S: 5-ft bike lane on both sides of Northup Way/NE 20th St from 124th Ave NE to 140th Ave NE.

B-110-N/S: 5-ft bike lane on both sides of Northup Way from 120th Avenue NE to 124th Avenue NE. **Done.** 

MIP LTS Target: LTS 3 w/o 136<sup>th</sup> Ave NE, LTS 1 136<sup>th</sup> – 140<sup>th</sup>


MIP Scoring for TFP: 14-18 points out of 20 points


#### **Planned Implementation:**

- Frontage improvements w/redevelopment
- WSDOT 124<sup>th</sup> Ave NE Interchange (directional bike lanes)


- 1. Implement Bike Bellevue
- 2. Implement Ped-Bike Plan Project B-111 with <u>buffered</u> bike lanes
- 3. Refer to the TFP

## Corridor 1: Northup Way



#### Staff Recommendation: Three segments with different categories

- <u>Category 1:</u> 120<sup>th</sup> Ave NE 124<sup>th</sup> Ave NE: Narrow travel lanes as feasible to provide a buffer for existing directional bike lanes.
- <u>Category 7:</u> 124<sup>th</sup> Ave NE 136<sup>th</sup> Ave NE: Implement Ped-Bike Plan project B-111 with <u>buffered</u> bike lanes with redevelopment plus WSDOT interchange project, and fill lingering gaps with city CIP program funding (may require acquiring right-of-way).
- Category 5: 136th Ave NE 140th Ave NE: Refer to the TFP for design and implementation as LTS 1 facility

#### **Commission Recommendation:**

### Corridor 3: Bel-Red Road



#### **Bike Bellevue:**

**B.** Convert 1 of 2 westbound lanes to one-way buffered bike lanes between NE Spring Boulevard and 124<sup>th</sup> Ave NE.

**C.** Maintain 2 westbound lanes and covert 1 of 2 eastbound lanes east of 124<sup>th</sup> Ave NE to accommodate one-way separated buffered bike lanes on each side of the street.

Ped-Bike Plan: None

MIP LTS Target: LTS 3

MIP Scoring for TFP: 15-16 points out of 20 points

- 1. Implement Bike Bellevue
- 2. Refer to TFP: Conduct a Bel-Red Road Corridor study for options to achieve LTS 3.

### Corridor 4: Bel-Red Road

#### **Bike Bellevue:**

**A.** Convert 1 of 2 eastbound lanes to one-way buffered bike lanes, retain 2 lanes westbound between 134<sup>th</sup> Ave NE and 143<sup>rd</sup> Ave NE

**B.** Between 143<sup>rd</sup> Ave NE and 148th Ave NE, 1 of 2 westbound lanes would be modified to provide a two-way left turn lane.


**C.** Convert 1 of 2 westbound lanes and retain 2 lanes eastbound at 148th Ave NE.

Ped-Bike Plan: None

MIP LTS Target: LTS 3

MIP Scoring for TFP: 18 out of 20 points

- 1. Implement Bike Bellevue
- 2. Refer to TFP: Conduct a Bel-Red Road Corridor study for options to achieve LTS 3



### Corridor 5: Bel-Red Road

#### **Bike Bellevue:**

- **A.** Convert 1 of 2 eastbound lanes to one-way buffered bike lanes between 148<sup>th</sup> Ave NE and NE 20<sup>th</sup> St
- **B.** Convert 1 eastbound lane and 1 westbound lane to oneway buffered bike lanes and install a two-way left turn lane between NE 20<sup>th</sup> St and NE 24<sup>th</sup> St
- **C.** Convert 1 of 2 eastbound lanes to one-way buffered bike lanes between NE 24<sup>th</sup> St and 156<sup>th</sup> Ave NE
- **D.** Remove northbound peak hour left turn restriction


#### Ped-Bike Plan:

B-115-E/W: Add a 5-foot-wide bike lane on the east side/west side of Bel-Red Road from 156<sup>th</sup> Ave NE to NE 20<sup>th</sup> St.

No bicycle project is identified west of NE 20<sup>th</sup> St.

MIP LTS Target: LTS 3

MIP Scoring for TFP: 15-18 points out of 20 points



- 1. Bike Bellevue
- 2. Refer to TFP. Conduct a Bel-Red Road Corridor study for options to achieve LTS 3.

## Corridors 3, 4, and 5: Bel-Red Road

#### **Staff Recommendation:**

Category 5: Refer to TFP: Conduct a corridor study of the entire Bel-Red Road corridor between Spring Boulevard/NE 12<sup>th</sup> Street on the west and 156<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE on the east, with the objective to find options achieve MIP LTS 3 Performance Target, or better.

Include in this corridor study, options to improve bicycle network connections to the Crossroads neighborhood.

Transportation Commission Recommendation:







### Corridor 11: 140<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE

#### **Bike Bellevue:**

Convert 1 of 2 southbound lanes to buffered bike lanes.


#### **Ped-Bike Plan:**

B-112-E/W: Add 5-foot bike lanes on both sides of 140<sup>th</sup> Ave NE between NE 24<sup>th</sup> St and NE 8<sup>th</sup> St. Priority Bike Corridor.

MIP LTS Target: LTS 1

MIP Scoring for TFP: 18 points out of 20 points

- 1. Implement Bike Bellevue
- 2. Implement Ped-Bike Plan projects w/redevelopment
- 3. Refer to the TFP: Conduct a corridor study for options to achieve LTS 1.
- 4. Refer to the TFP: Design and build a multipurpose path north side of Bel-Red Rd. west of 140<sup>th</sup> Ave NE to Spring Boulevard spur, sharrow lane markings on Spring Boulevard spur.
  - 4.1. Include design for buffered bike lanes to build with redevelopment on Spring Boulevard spur.



## Corridor 11: 140<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE



Multipurpose path north side of Bel-Red Rd. west of 140<sup>th</sup> Ave NE to Spring Boulevard spur, sharrow lane markings on Spring Boulevard spur.


• Buffered bike lanes on Spring Boulevard spur.



### Corridor 11: 140<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE

#### **Staff Recommendation:**

- Short term:
  - Enhance existing bike lane and sharrow lane markings with refreshed paint and wayfinding.
- Longer term:
  - <u>Category 5:</u> Refer to the TFP: Conduct a corridor study for options to achieve LTS 1 on the 140<sup>th</sup>
     Ave NE corridor, connect to Northup Way Priority
     Bike Corridor and the SR 520 Trail.
  - Category 5: Refer to the TFP: Design and build a multipurpose path north side of Bel-Red Rd. west of 140<sup>th</sup> Ave NE to Spring Boulevard spur, with sharrow lane markings on Spring Boulevard spur. Include design for buffered bike lanes on Spring Boulevard spur to build with redevelopment.


