SUBJECT: Commission Discussion of ARPA Applicants (Session 2 of 3)

The Commission will discuss the applicants requesting funding for child care, basic needs and food insecurity and determine preliminary funding recommendations.

Background

33 Agencies submitted a total of 46 applications requesting over \$6.8 million. The Commission will recommend to the City Council how to distribute the approximately \$3 million available. Below is an overview of the critical needs addressed in this funding round.
