

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6862

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the execution of a sub-contract (and supplements if necessary) with the Dispute Resolution Center of Kitsap County, as lead fiscal agent for Resolution Washington, to accept grant funds in the amount of \$618,714 from the Washington Department of Commerce (Sub-Grantee Contract S26-34445-001) for staffing and administrative costs associated with delivery of conflict resolution services offered through the Bellevue Conflict Resolution Center.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute a sub-contract (and supplements if necessary) with the Dispute Resolution Center of Kitsap County, as lead fiscal agent for Resolution Washington, to accept grant funds in the amount of \$618,714 from the Washington Department of Commerce (Sub-Grantee Contract S26-34445-001) for staffing and administrative costs associated with delivery of conflict resolution services offered through the Bellevue Conflict Resolution Center, a copy of which agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said agreement and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 3. At the time of execution of said Grant Agreement and acceptance of said funds, a project shall be established within the Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserve Fund into which all said respective monies shall be deposited.

Section 4. The approximate amount and anticipated source of revenue for said grant monies is:

Section 5. The 2025-2026 budget for the Operating Grants and Donations Fund already includes sufficient appropriation for this biennium. Appropriation for the contract value in 2027 will be submitted to Council via the 2027-2028 budget process.

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in said agreement shall be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 6. Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
