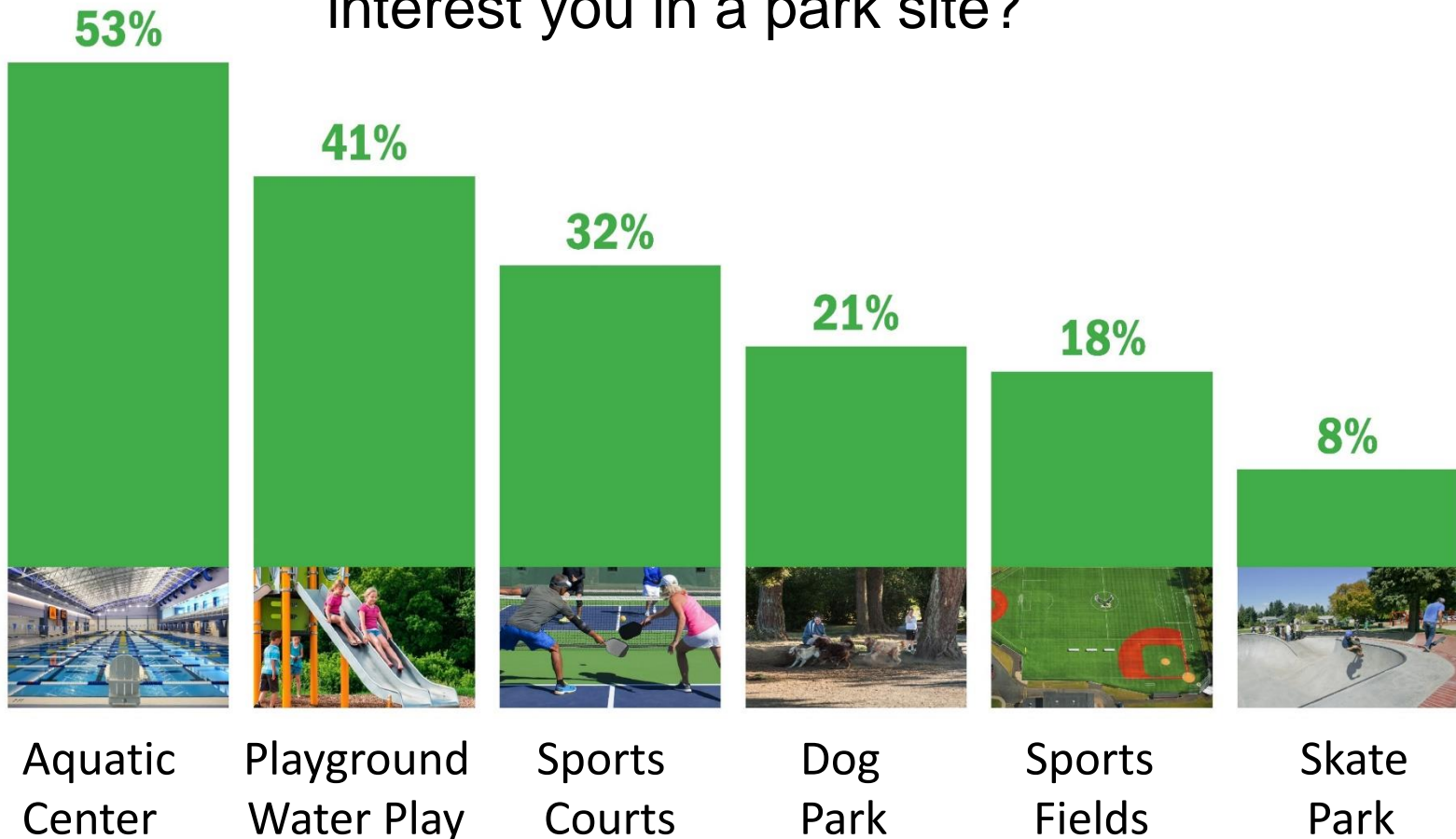

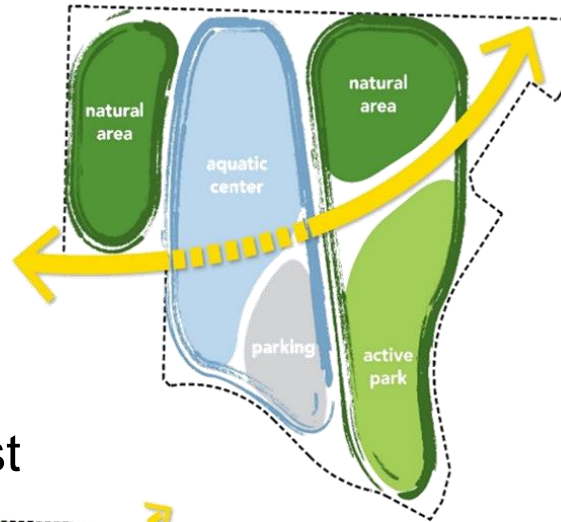

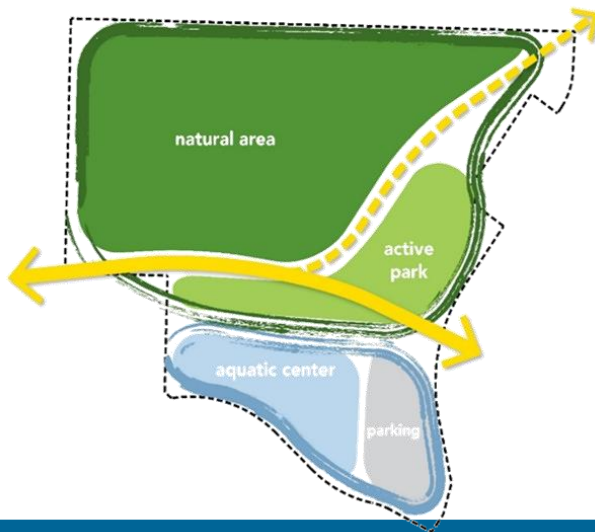

- Preferred Passive Programs: Trails and Picnic Areas

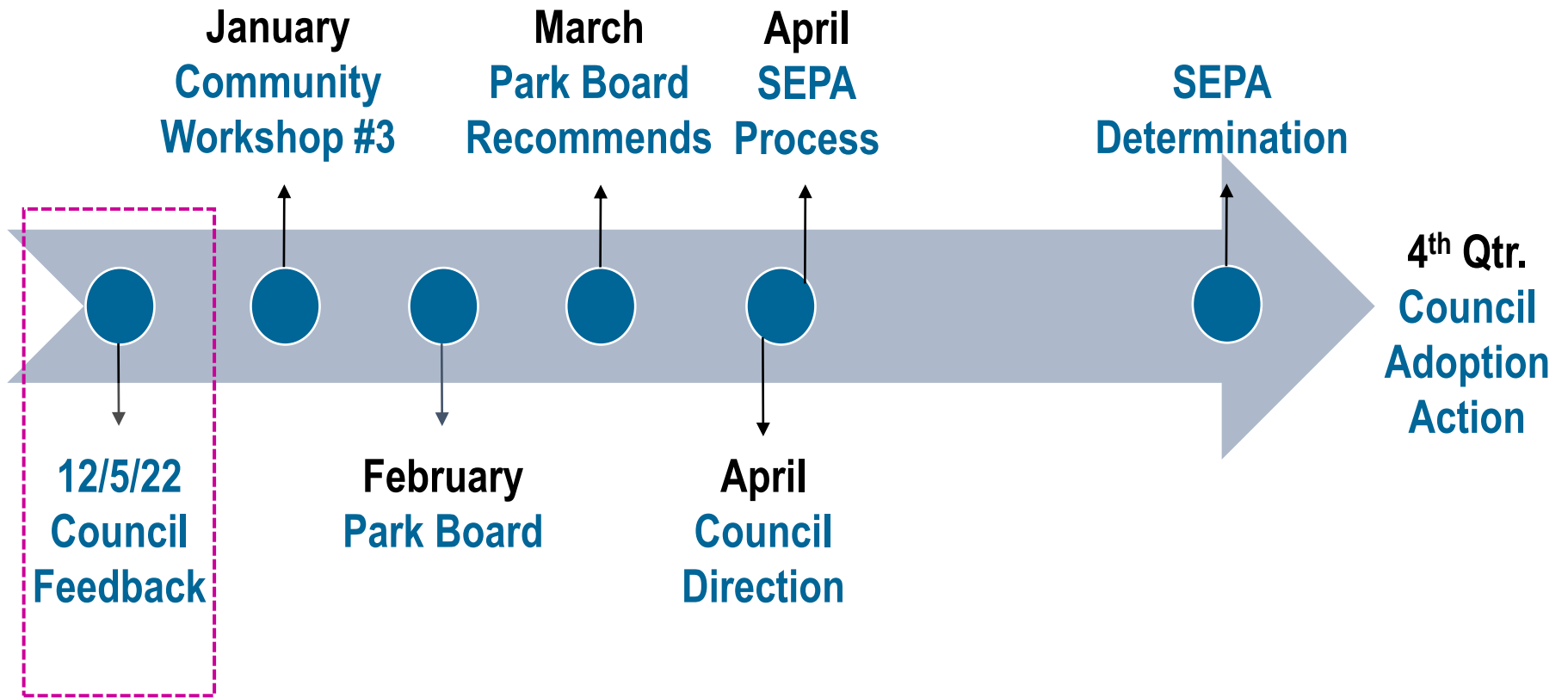
## Adjacent Neighbors
