Background

The City of Bellevue contracts with three agencies to provide jail services: South Correctional Entity (SCORE), King County, and the City of Issaquah. While SCORE remains the City's primary jail, King County is currently the only one of the three agencies that will house a City inmate booked on a felony investigation. Unlike the City of Issaquah facility, King County is also able to accommodate inmates with psychiatric and medical needs. The City additionally uses the King County facility to house misdemeanor offenders when SCORE reaches capacity. Over 95 percent of Bellevue's misdemeanor jail population is housed at SCORE jail while less than 5 percent are housed at KC Jail.

Background

- 1. This is a two year agreement.
- 2. This is the same contract offered to other partner cities except for Seattle (which has a contract that runs through 2030.)
- 3. There is no costs to the City of Bellevue for felony booking or felonies combined with misdemeanor bookings.

Fiscal Impact

 This is a pay as we use contract. There is no fixed cost associated with the contract. We have no guaranteed beds.
