CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON ORDINANCE NO. 6856

AN ORDINANCE 1) authorizing execution of a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$311,000 in state Regional Mobility Program grant funding to support the *City of Bellevue Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Program 2025 – 2027* project in state fiscal years 2026 and 2027; and 2) amending the City of Bellevue 2025-2026 Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserves Fund to increase the appropriation by \$311,000; providing for severability; and establishing an effective date.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$311,000 in state Regional Mobility Program grant funding to support the *City of Bellevue Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Program 2025 – 2027* project in state fiscal years 2026 and 2027, a copy of which grant agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said Grant Agreement and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 6822, adopted on November 19, 2024, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the 2025-2026 budget, by increasing appropriations to the Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserves Fund by \$311,000 in anticipated grant funds to be received from the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT).

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in said Agreement shall be more of less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 4. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
