Overview

Crossroads, in cooperation with the City of Bellevue, initiated an outreach campaign to elicit comments from the community on how to strengthen the connection between the shopping center and the park.

Surveying was conducted from December 14th, 2018 – January 5th, 2019. It was our expectation that being in the field over the holiday period would reveal a broader cross section of neighbors and neighborhoods since more people shop the center at this time of year.

During this period, an exhibit was installed at the Mini City Hall at Crossroads. The display included poster-sized exhibits, response cards, and a box for collection of those responses.

In addition to the collection point at Mini City Hall, we executed a survey online at www.crossroadsbellevue.com. The prompt for the survey was featured prominently on the home page, and stayed there for the duration of the survey. Survey Monkey was used to capture and analyze the feedback.

Finally, a suite of collateral was developed to encourage the community to take the survey. The collateral was placed at the Parks and Recreation Office, and at various points around the Crossroads shopping center.

Summary of Results

The survey generated feedback from 498 respondents, showing a high level of interest in and engagement with the topic:

Offline respondents*	324
Total respondents	498

By in large, we found priorities among both pools of respondents to be similar. A summary of results follows:

- The Crossroads customer drives to the center and visits weekly.
- His/her most important goals with the new park connection are (in order of priority):
 1. Design for connections between Crossroads Park and Crossroads Mall and provide community gathering spaces
 2. Encourage all age engagement and provide accessibility for all
 3. Ensure design for safety and security for users and the community
 4. Protect natural environment
 5. Design for visual interest
- His/her top three things to do in a new park connection are to host special events, small gatherings, and just pass through.
- In terms of amenities he/she would like to see there, natural elements and seating (all kinds) topped the list.
- And lastly, he/she would like to see layered lighting, wall treatments, and functional art installed in the connection.
- The above feedback indicates a preference by the community for organic treatments, intimate settings and more passive elements as opposed to highly programmed, stylized elements and spaces.
- Write-in responses ran the gamut. Parking and accessibility seem to rise to the top.

* Please note: not all offline respondents answered all survey questions nor answered them correctly.

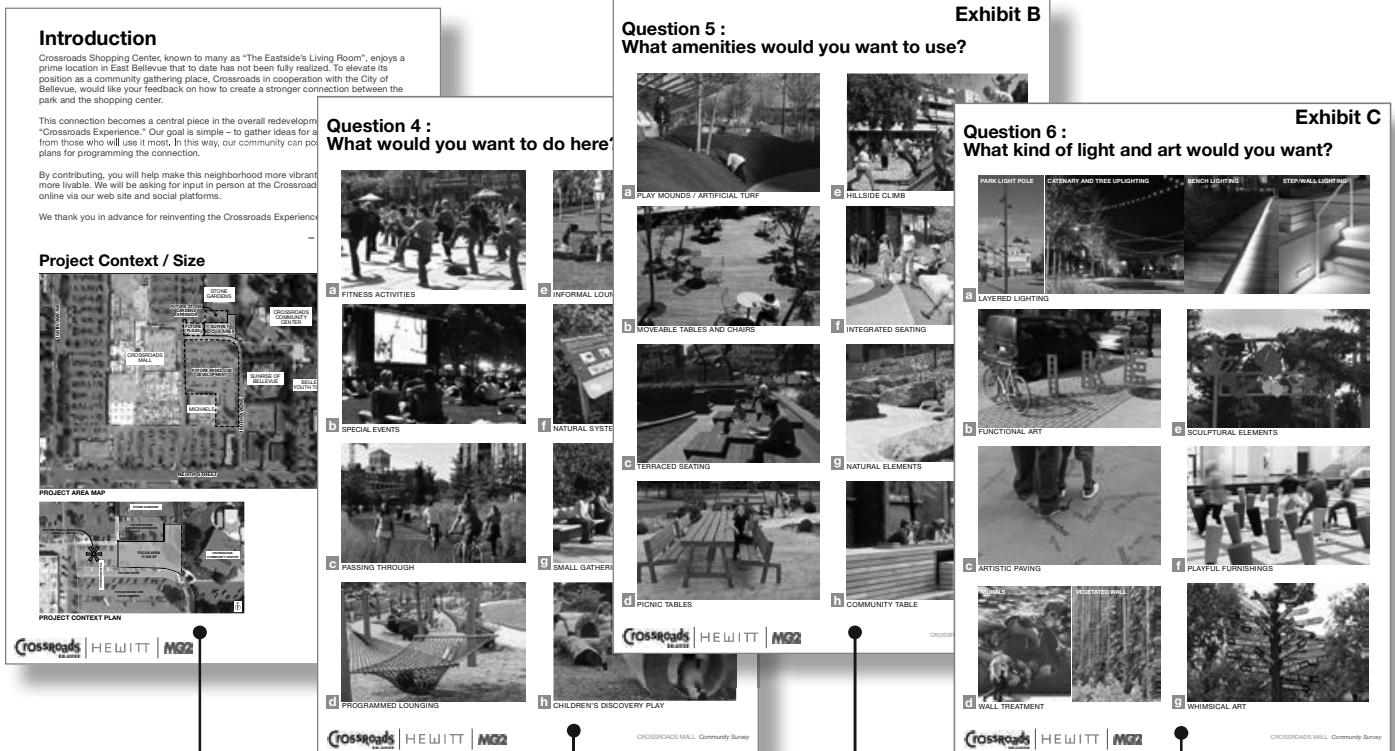

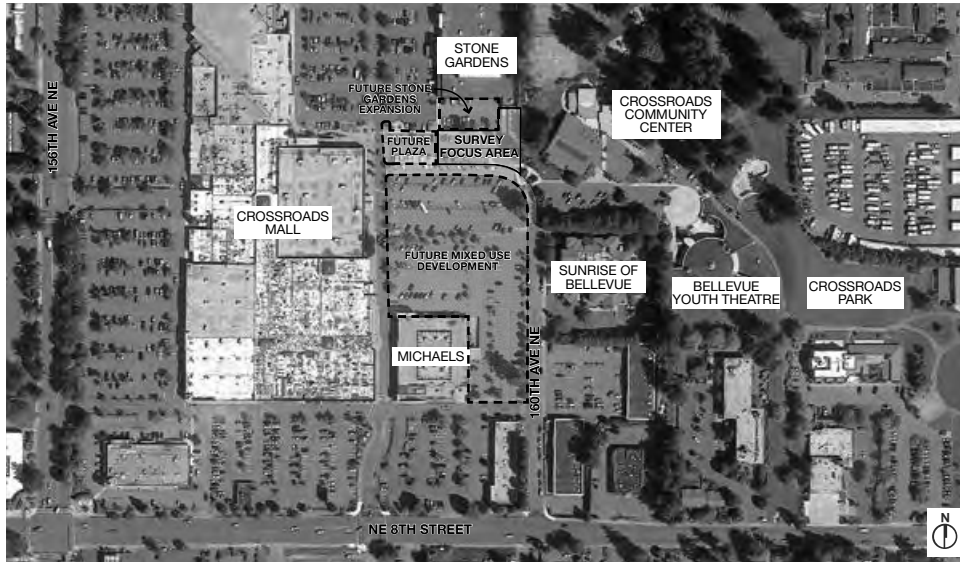

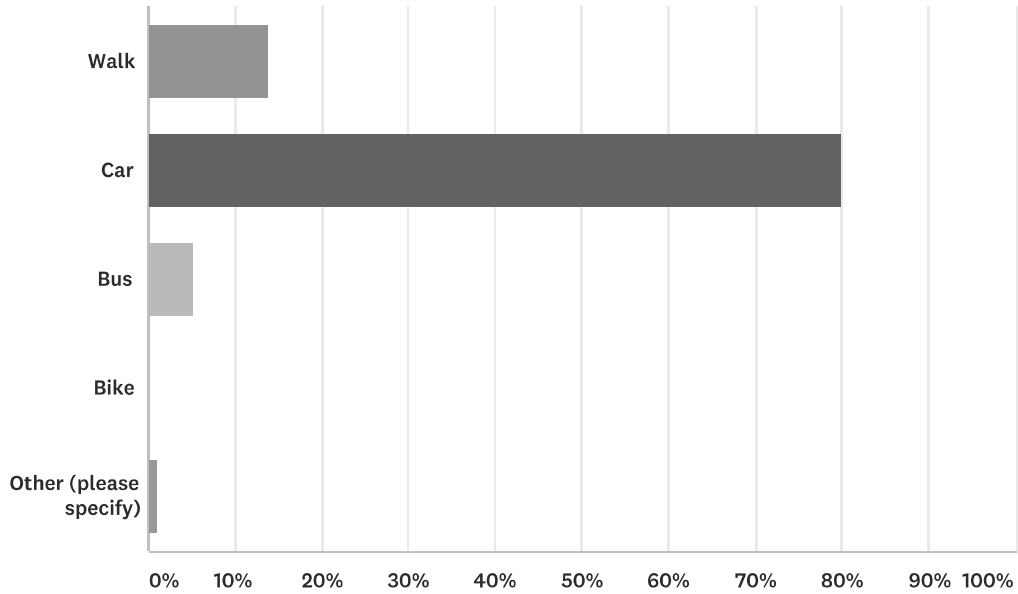

Q1 How do you get to Crossroads Shopping Center?

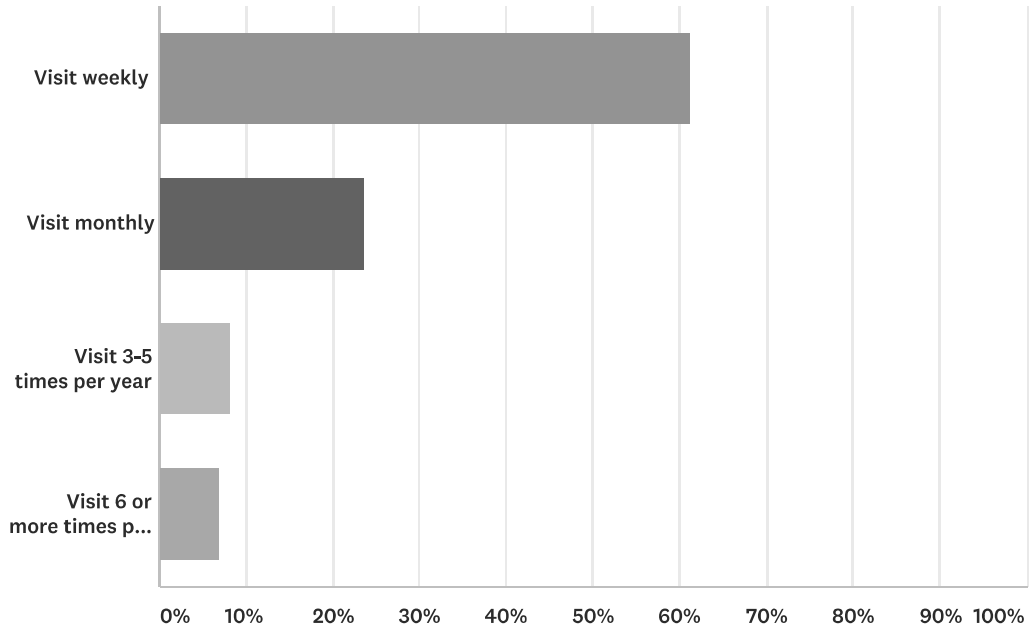

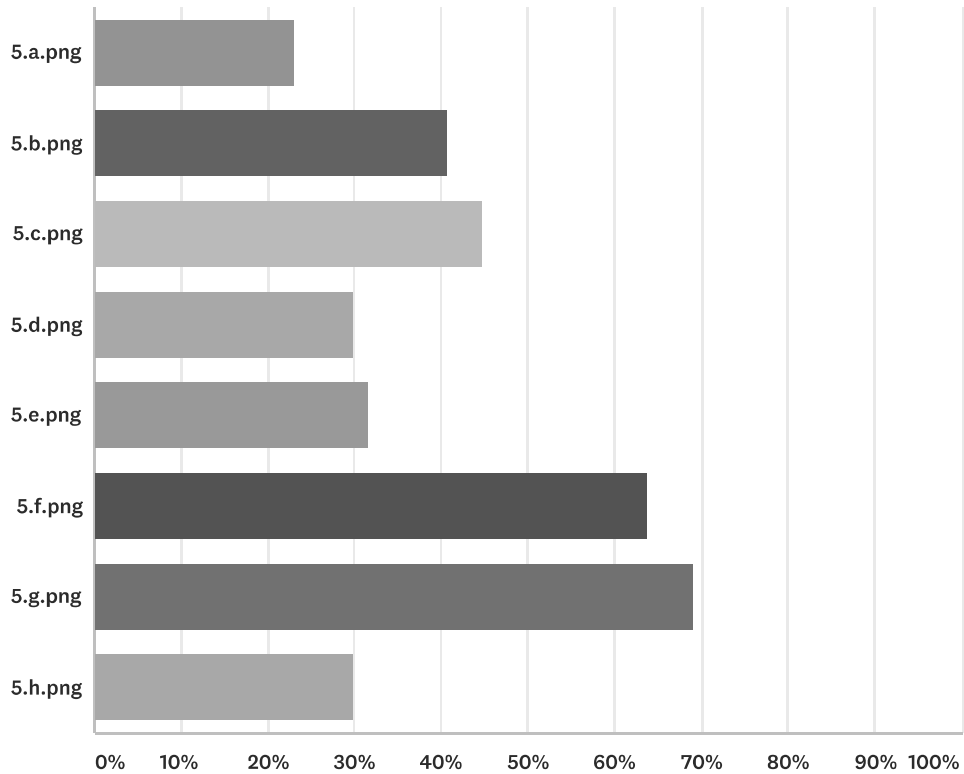

Q5 What amenities would you want to use in the new park connection? (choose 3)

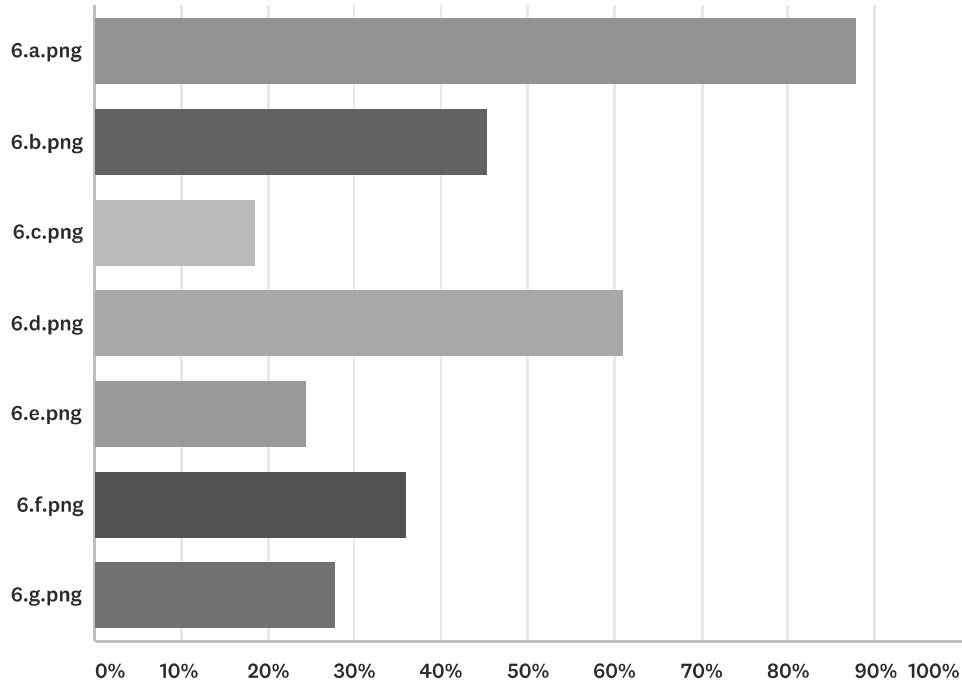
