Whereas: The U.S. Census estimates that two million people of Korean descent

currently reside in the United States; and

Whereas: Korean American Day commemorates the arrival of the first Korean

immigrants to the United States and honors Korean Americans'

incredible resilience and contributions to society; and

Whereas: The commemorative day was officially recognized by the U.S. Senate

and House in 2005; and

Whereas: Korean influences in Bellevue range from business development

investments – especially in the tech industry – to a rich variety of Korean restaurants and shops to bilingual education programs in our schools and one of the first Korean Schools in the U.S. that is a vital

part of Korean-American education for our region; and

Whereas: The City of Bellevue recognizes and appreciates the strength of our

community's diversity, including the important influences from Korean

Americans that are worth celebrating and emphasizing.

Now, therefore, I, Lynne Robinson, mayor of Bellevue, Washington, on behalf of the

Council, do hereby proclaim Jan. 13, 2024, as:

Korean American Day

in Bellevue, to honor the contributions and cultural influences of Korean Americans as key attributes in Bellevue and our region.
