City in a Park

- Hundreds of thousands of people will visit Bellevue's parks, natural areas, and trails during the busy summer season, depending on weather.
- Summer parks high use starts as early as May 1.



Lifeguards & Beaches

- There are 6 lifeguarded beaches located throughout the City of Bellevue.
- Over 45,000 people visit Bellevue beaches each summer.
- When all the beaches are open, 65-70 lifeguards are needed to help keep people safe when they visit.



Summer Day Camps

- A variety of camps are offered in the summer.
- 2,500 participants registered in 2022, serving over 1,000 households.
- We're expecting this number to grow in 2023.
