

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6910

An ORDINANCE authorizing 1) execution of a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$1,317,725 in federal Surface Transportation Block Grant program funding provided through the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) to support design of the SE Eastgate Way Sidewalk Project (CIP Plan No. PW-WB-91); (2) amending the 2025-2030 General Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Fund to increase the budget for CIP Plan No. PW-WB-91 by \$249,225; providing for severability; and establishing an effective date.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to execute a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$1,317,725 in federal Surface Transportation Block Grant program funding provided through the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) to support design of the SE Eastgate Way Sidewalk Project (CIP Plan No. PW-WB-91), a copy of which agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No. _____.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said Grant Agreement and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 6822, adopted on November 19, 2024, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the budget for CIP Plan No. PW-WB-91 by \$249,225 in anticipated grant funds to be received from the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT).

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in said Agreement shall be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
