Whereas: according to the U.S. Small Business Administration, more than 650,000 small

businesses in Washington employ more than 1.4 million workers and continue to

drive local innovation and opportunity; and

Whereas: nearly half (46%) of small businesses in Washington are women-owned and 15%

are minority-owned, reflecting the diversity, resilience and entrepreneurial spirit

that strengthen our communities; and

Whereas: Bellevue is home to a vibrant network of organizations - including the Bellevue

Downtown Association, Visit Bellevue and other regional groups - that champion

small businesses and entrepreneurship through initiatives that encourage

innovation, resilience and economic vitality; and

Whereas: the City of Bellevue has launched new services to better support small

businesses and entrepreneurs, including a collaboration with the Washington Small Business Development Center and expanded offerings from the city's

Economic Development and Development Services teams - providing

coordinated, no-cost advising and personalized support.
