Whereas: Bellevue is known and celebrated as a "City in a Park" and has worked for seven decades

to steward the environment; and

Whereas: Bellevue, for the 32<sup>nd</sup> consecutive year, has been recognized as a Tree City USA

community by the National Arbor Day Foundation and is dedicated to maintaining its tree-

planting practices; and

Whereas: Bellevue has established ambitious goals related to climate change, energy, mobility, land

use, waste and natural systems in the Sustainable Bellevue Environmental Stewardship

Plan; and

Whereas: Community participation is an essential aspect of achieving Bellevue's environmental

goals, and Earth Day is an opportunity for people in the community to learn, volunteer

and get engaged; and

Whereas: Bellevue's commitment to our environment continues to grow, including new initiatives

like Keep Bellevue Beautiful, partnering with our community to keep Bellevue litter free;

and

Whereas: People who live and work in Bellevue can go to bellevueclimatechallenge.org to sign-up and

commute more green and sustainable and learn about other actions to reduce your
