b)	RES 9656	Resolution authorizing execution of a five-year wireless communications facility site lease agreement with Seattle SMSA Limited Partnership dba Verizon Wireless, including a five-year extension option for the continued operation of an existing Wireless Communications Facility (WCF) at Coal Creek Natural Area located at 15502 Newcastle Golf Club Road.
c)	19-458	Motion to award Bid No. 19039, Lake Hills Boulevard Crosswalk Improvements (CIP Plan No. PW-R-199) to NPM Construction Co. as the lowest responsible and responsive bidder, in the amount of \$218,207.00, plus all applicable taxes. This project is fully funded by the Neighborhood Safety, Connectivity and Congestion Levy.
