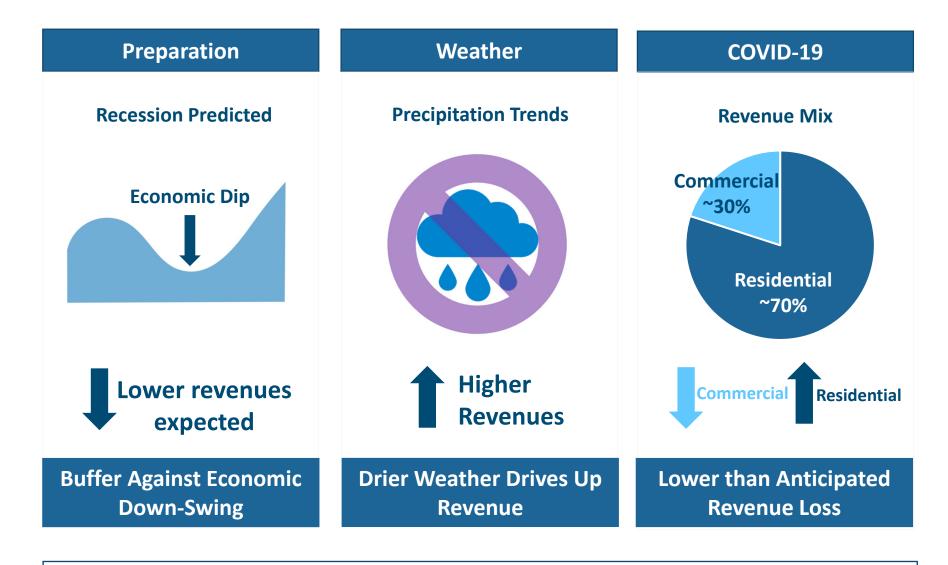

2020 Highlights

- ❖ All Utilities ended 2020 in positive financial condition
 - Operating revenues exceeded operating expenses
 - Fund balances above expectations
- ❖ Per city policy, fund balances that are greater than budget at the end of the budget cycle, in 2020, for the piped utilities are transferred to capital infrastructure renewal & replacement (R&R) account until projected R&R account funds are adequate to meet long term needs.

\$6.0M above budget

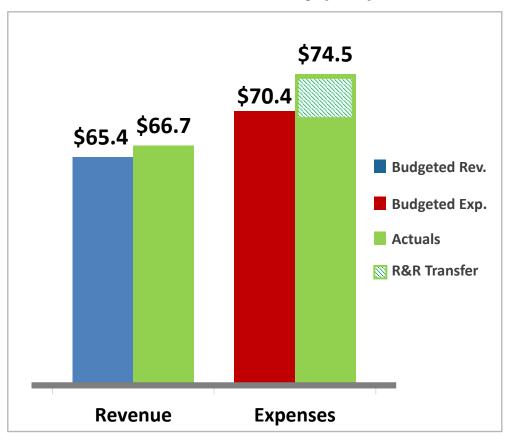
Revenue

- \$1.3M above budget
- Largely driven by:
 - Anticipated recession
 - Drier weather
 - Moderate COVID-19 Impact

Expenditures

- \$1.3M lower than budget
- Largely driven by:
 - Savings from personnel vacancies and operational under-expenditures

2020 Water Utility (\$M)

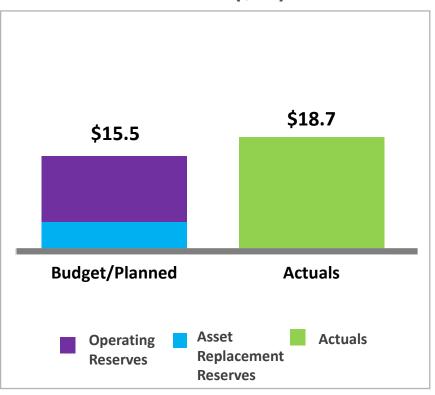

• \$3.4M over budget

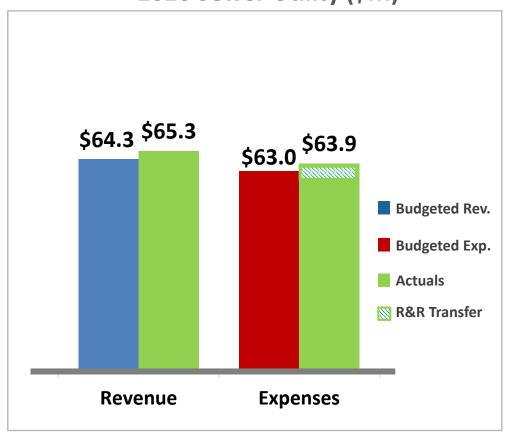
Resources

2020 Sewer Utility (\$M)

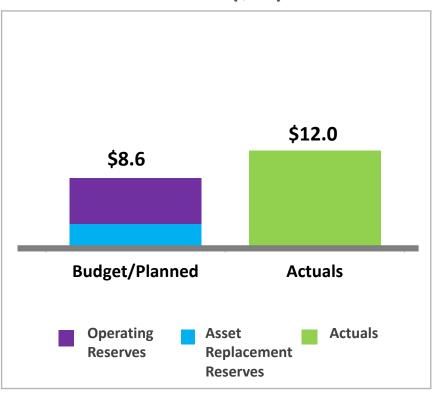

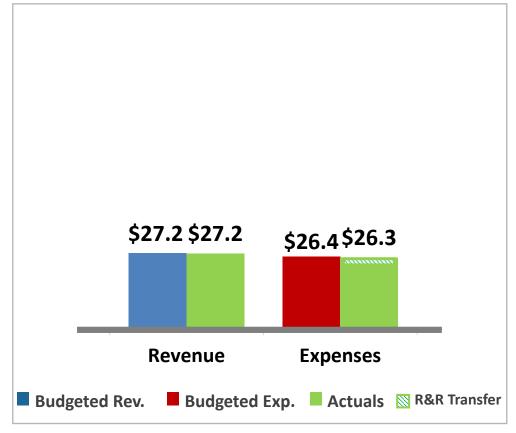

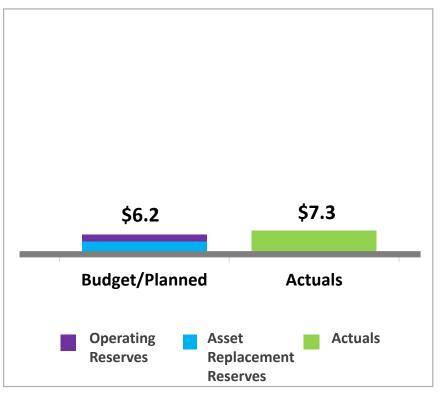


Storm Utility Highlights

 \$0.2M above budget due to unearned bonus revenue

Expenditures

- \$0.3M lower than budget
- Largely driven by operational savings

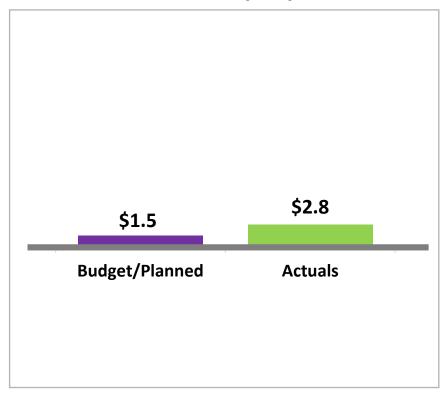


Solid Waste Utility Highlights
