

Why a New Program

- Potential new funding source
 - □ Possibility of accepting donations on the bill with new billing system
- Existing gap
 - Not all low-income customers qualify for existing programs

New Program: Temporary relief for expanded eligibility pool

Examples of Low-income Customers this would Help

- ■Senior/disabled customers who disqualified based on
- prior year's income
- □New retired senior
- □ Disabled resident with no disability proof
- □ Resident with critical sickness and ongoing high
- treatment costs
- □ Families with limited financial resources

Benchmarking of other Donation Programs

Key Components:

- 1) Unique branding to communicate purpose and nature of the program
- 2) Accept recurring donations on the utility bill and one time donations online
- 3) Dedicated for Temporary Relief

Receiving Donation Funds:

Customer

- Recurring fixed amount on the bill
- One-time online donation

Non-Customer

• One-time online donation

Utilities Contribution

- Seed with \$50K, and
- Up to \$50K match per year

Using Donations to Fill the Gap

Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Preventing Water Shutoff



Waive up to

Months Utility Bills

- Available to low-income residents with an Urgent / Shutoff Notice
- 100% reduction on basic utility bill
 - Up to \$333 credit for two months if eligible for donation funds only
 - Up to \$1,000 credit for 6 months if eligible for both EAP and donation funds
- Pilot: evaluate donation level & terms to meet need as part of budget process

Next Steps

- Receive ESC feedback
- Develop implementation plan
- Develop communication plan
 - Informing customers of the new assistance available and what donations support
 - Informing the community on donation options
- Council approval
