
## 2022 Highlights

- Operating revenues exceeded operating expenses
- Fund balances above expectations
- Per city policy, fund balances that are greater than budget are transferred to capital infrastructure renewal & replacement (R&R) account until projected R&R account funds are adequate to meet long term needs.




## Water Utility Overview






#### **Seasonal Variability in Water Usage**




## **Sewer Utility Overview**






#### Storm & Surface Water Utility Overview
