Whereas: Human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery and found in the United States most

often in the form of sexual exploitation, forced labor, involuntary servitude and debt

bondage; and

Whereas: This terrible crime, which denies human dignity and freedom, and fuels organized crime,

exists in our nation, and in our own community; and

Whereas: Even though awareness of this crime is growing, human trafficking continues to go

unreported due to its isolating nature and lack of awareness; and

Whereas: Increased community education on how to identify victims along with increased

knowledge of local resources and services for those impacted can help restore freedom

and dignity to identified survivors, as well as prevent future victims; and

Whereas: The Bellevue Police Department partners with regional agencies to target online

human and sex trafficking rings; and the city will continue in its efforts to fight illicit

activity; and

Whereas: Victims and survivors are encouraged to call the national hotline at 888-373-7888 or visit

WATraffickingHelp.org;
