EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As directed by Council, staff is returning with a Resolution to authorize adoption of the Parks & Community Services Board recommended and the community preferred name of “Newport Hills Woodlawn Park” for the new park in the Newport Hills Neighborhood.

RECOMMENDATION

Move to adopt Resolution No. 10058

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

At the December 13, 2021, study session, Council reviewed the processes, deliberations, surveys, and recommendations to select a name for the new park in the Newport Hills neighborhood located at 11560 SE 60th Street. Council agreed with the community surveyed preference and the September 14, 2021, Parks & Community Services Board name recommendation. As directed by Council, staff is returning with a Resolution to adopt the name “Newport Hills Woodlawn Park” for the new park.

Construction of the park is underway and is anticipated to be complete in summer 2022.

POLICY & FISCAL IMPACTS

Policy Impact

Resolution No. 8229 sets forth the policy and procedure for naming public parks and recreation facilities. The City Council designates the names of public parks and park or recreation facilities and may seek a recommendation from the Park Board, which is based on public input from individuals and organizations.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with adopting the name of a new park.

OPTIONS

1. Adopt the Resolution adopting “Newport Hills Woodlawn Park” as the name for the new park in the Newport Hills Neighborhood located at 11560 SE 60th Street.
2. Do not adopt the Resolution and provide alternative direction to staff.
