
History of Human Service

- 1986: Council adopted human services policies; established the Human Services Commission.
- Defined role of City in Human Services:
 Planner, Facilitator & Funder.

Regional Approach

- Collaborate with Human Services staff from East King County Suburban Cities
- Joint Human Services Commission Meetings
- Ensure that Eastside voice is included in considerations for Regional Planning

Needs Update Overview

- Guides the recommendations of Human Services Commission for allocation of 2023-2024 Human Services Fund
- Directs the work of Human Services Division
- Provides information for providers, community groups and regional planning

COVID-19 Impacts



- Disproportionate impacts of COVID-19 for communities of color.
- Phone/online survey: Roughly 1 in 6 (16%) of Bellevue households experienced a decrease in their income as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Human service providers continue to face increased capacity challenges. COVID-19 has caused a tremendous upsurge in service need, and a need to swiftly adjust how services are delivered.

Affordable Housing

- Phone/online Survey: 74% rated lack of affordable housing as the number one community problem.
- Almost one in three (30%) of Bellevue renters are cost burdened.
- 31% of older adult renters pay more than 50% of their income towards rent.



Living Wage

- Phone/online survey: 49% rated people having jobs that do not pay enough for the basics as a major or moderate community problem.
- Consumer survey: 36% of the respondents with an income below \$50,000 reported that they either rarely or never can find work that supports themselves or their family.



Homelessness



- Phone/online survey: 46% identified homelessness as a major or moderate problem in the community.
- 2020 Count Us In: 446 unsheltered individuals in East King County counted. 32% increase from the 2019 count.
- Bellevue School District: 333 students qualified as homeless under the McKinney -Vento Act in the 2020-2021 school year.

Behavioral Health



- Phone/online survey: 24% of respondents rated anxiety, stress, or depression which interferes with your daily life as a major or moderate issue.
- Provider's survey: 58% reported that their clients need mental health care but cannot access it.
- Rate of youth suicidal ideation and attempt has been rising over the last several years.
- In King County, the number of fentanyl-involved overdose deaths between March and June 2020 was triple the number in the same months of 2019.

Domestic Violence



- Phone/online survey: 27% of respondents rated
 Domestic Violence as a major or moderate community problem, which is a 9% increase from 2019.
- Domestic Violence homicides nearly doubled in 2020 compared to prior years.
- DV providers report an increase in request for services. Bellevue Police Department recorded 1,137 incidents where Domestic Violence was indicated in 2020, which is similar to past years.

Culturally & Linguistically Responsive Services


- Nearly 55,000 Bellevue households speak a language other than English at home.
- Bellevue School District reports 104 languages spoken.
- Phone/online survey: 26% rated lack of services for non-English speaker in the community was a moderate or major problem.
- Community conversations: Providers stated that there is a need for more diverse staff who are not only bilingual but also culturally competent, highlighting the importance for behavioral health services.



Racial and Ethnic Discrimination

- Phone/online survey: 35% rated racial or ethnic discrimination as a major or moderate community problem.
- Hate Crimes & Bias Incidents:
 - Bellevue Police Department received the following reports: Between January and June of 2021: 10 hate crimes and 12 bias incidents
 - In 2020: 18 hate crimes and 5 bias incidents
- King County Coalition Against Hate and Bias received 87 reports of hate crimes and bias incidents in East King County between April 2020 and May 2021.

Access to Transportation



- Provider's survey: 63% reported that transportation was a barrier to accessing services for their clients.
- Phone/online survey: 41% rated inadequate public transportation as a community problem and 41% rated lack of other transportation option (besides public transportation) as a community problem.

Next Steps



- Continued coordination between departments and plans
- Funding application for Human Services Fund is available mid-March
- Completed non-profit applications due in mid-April
- Recommendations brought to Council Fall 2022.
