Whereas: Women's History Month began as "Women's History Week" in 1981 when

Congress authorized and requested the week to be proclaimed beginning March

7, 1982; and

Whereas: In countless recorded and unrecorded ways, American women of every race,

class, and ethnic background have made historic impacts to the growth and

strength of our nation, state and local communities; and

Whereas: American women have been leaders, not only in securing their own rights of

suffrage and equal opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other efforts including the peace movement, which strives to

create a more just society for all; and

Whereas: We must reflect on the on the significant burdens women and girls continue to

bear today, particularly women of color, including unequal wages,

disproportionate childcare responsibilities, lack of access to healthcare and loss of employment especially during the pandemic, while acknowledging that much

more needs to be done to overcome these barriers; and

Whereas: Equity, access, inclusion and opportunity for all people are values at the core of

the City of Bellevue's community vision and the ongoing work of the Diversity

Advantage Plan; and

**Whereas:** Recognizing the importance of women's contributions helps to ensure these

efforts will not be overlooked in the literature, teaching and study of American

history.
