and get engaged; and

Whereas: Bellevue, for the 31st consecutive year, has been recognized as a Tree City USA community

by the National Arbor Day Foundation and is dedicated to maintaining its tree-planting

practices; and

Whereas: Trees are integral to the lives of fish, wildlife, and people in Bellevue; and

Whereas: On Earth Day, Bellevue will launch a new Sustainable Bellevue Climate Challenge, with

actions to reduce environmental impacts and opportunities to get involved and make a

difference; and

sign-up and participate in a friendly competition to take steps to reduce energy use at home, green your commute, and learn about other actions to reduce your environmental impact.
