



- Notable project completions: Downtown Park – Completing the Circle, Surrey Downs Park, Botanical Garden Visitors Center and Ravine Garden, BYT, Lake Sammamish acquisitions.



Public Outreach - Surveys

Statistically valid (ABS) resident survey

- 465 responses
- 78% conducted online, 22% conducted by phone
- 5% completed in a language other than English

Open park user survey

- 383 responses
- All online
- 1% completed in a language other than English

Current Funding Review



2008 Parks and Natural Areas Levy

- Approved by 67%; Two components
 - \$3.4M annual revenue for capital project improvements over 20 years from 2009 to 2028;
 - Estimated future collection thru 2028 = \$20.4M
 - Pending projects: Airfield Park and NP along Lake Sammamish
 - 2. \$660K annually for Maintenance and Operation (permanent)


