Background

March 3, 2020: Mayor Lynne Robinson signs a proclamation of emergency that allows the city to act quickly to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

March 23, 2020: "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order calls for residents to stay home unless they need to pursue an <u>essential activity</u>, bans gatherings and allows only essential businesses to remain open.

April 15, 2021: All Washingtonians over age 16, starting April 15, are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

Sept. 2, 2021: With the delta variant still surging in King County, Public Health – Seattle & King County issued a <u>health officer order</u>, requiring anyone five years of age and older to wear face masks at any outdoor event with 500 or more people in attendance. The order takes effect Tuesday, Sept. 7

March 30, 2022: The City of Bellevue announces that <u>city facilities will reopen</u> <u>fully</u> as of Monday, April 4.


