older people across the country; and in 1980 President Carter changed the name to Older

Americans Month; and

Whereas: The City of Bellevue includes a growing number of older Americans with a wealth of

knowledge and experience; 14% of the city's residents are 65 years of age or older; and

Whereas: People are living longer; over the last decade, the average life expectancy in King County

rose to 81.7 years, exceeding both the national and state averages; and

Whereas: In a recent survey for the Human Needs Update, nearly a third of residents noted lack of

services for aging adults as a community issue; and

Whereas: The City of Bellevue provides opportunities to meet the changing needs of a more active,

diverse older adult population; and

Whereas: The Bellevue Network on Aging, a group of volunteers and staff, is dedicated to healthy

aging in the community by promoting awareness of needs and resources that support

older adults through life's transitions; and

Whereas: The City of Bellevue engages older adults through education, recreation, and service

and encourages people of all ages to celebrate connections and resilience.

Council, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2022 as:
