CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON ORDINANCE NO. 6661

AN ORDINANCE 1) authorizing execution of an interagency agreement with the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (WSCJTC) to provide an instructor to the WSCJTC and to accept full reimbursement of the employee's salary and benefit costs, 2) amending the 2021-2022 General Fund Budget by \$118,869.95, and 3) authorizing an additional full-time employee position to be paid from the funds received under this agreement; providing for severability; and establishing an effective date.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute an interagency agreement with the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (WSCJTC) to provide an instructor to the WSCJTC and accept full reimbursement of the employee's salary and benefit costs, a copy of which interagency agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No. ______.
- Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are authorized to receive the monies anticipated herein and to expend the same as authorized in said interagency agreement.
- Section 3. The 2021-2022 General Fund Budget, adopted by Ordinance 6557 on December 14, 2020, as previously amended, is further amended to increase the revenue and appropriation by \$118,869.95, provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified should be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the revenue and appropriation shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.
- Section 4. The Police Department is authorized to add an additional full-time employee (FTE) position for the period that the employee is serving as an instructor at the WSCJTC, provided that the new FTE position is funded with the monies received from the WSCJTC.
- Section 5. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage and legal publication.
