Background:

In 2022, Experience Bellevue! Neighborhoods Conference welcomed Bellevue's community back to City Hall after over two years of pandemic and remote-only engagement. With the opportunity to "come for an hour or come for the day.", the Saturday was rich with indoor and outdoor experiences, including, 17 workshops that included walking, park and tree tours, and two bus excursions.

The conference kicked off with a "meet and mingle" breakfast with the city council followed by councilmembers sharing their reflections in an interview format. An art exhibit from the Cultural Craft Club at Interlake High School, an HR recruiting exhibit and information tables in the concourse offered additional resources and take-home information for participants.

Bellevue Neighborhoods Conference was first introduced in 2016 and scheduled as a biannual event in the Spring. The 2016 neighborhood conference was neighborhood focused, with themes of building community, diversity, neighborhood safety and navigating city programs. In 2018 the neighborhood conference attracted a younger, more diverse audience with an overarching theme of Innovation – centered around transportation, the environment, urban growth, and community stories. Due to the pandemic, there was no neighborhood conference in 2020.

Key program goals:

Provided an accessible opportunity for residents to engage with the city and with each other in a relaxed, "choose your custom experience" environment. Many topics and entry points provided the opportunity for those engaging for the first time to explore areas of interest and for those who engage often, like Bellevue Essentials graduates, a chance to continue their city education.

Create a growing and more knowledgeable resident base for future city engagement When residents understand how the City functions and participate in government, they become ambassadors for the city and provide voice and meaningful engagement in the future.

Build and strengthen staff relationships with residents After a long absence from personal contact, the conference gave staff from multiple departments the opportunity to interact with the community in a learning and exploring environment. These interactions help build strong, on-going staff-resident relationships as well as trust in local government.
