RESOLUTION NO. 10109

A RESOLUTION authorizing submittal of three grant applications requesting a combined total of up to \$3.35 million from the State of Washington's Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) for (1) up to \$2 million to assist with the cost of constructing a neighborhood park on 140th Avenue NE in the Bridle Trails Neighborhood Area, (2) up to \$997,400 to assist with the cost of constructing a multi-use trail at Mercer Slough Nature Park to connect the Mountains to Sound and Eastrail regional trails, and (3) up to \$350,000 to assist with the cost of replacing the existing aged synthetic turf sports field at Newport Hills Park.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.
