## Background

#### **Council Priority #17:**

Explore a safe parking program for homelessness response.

#### What is safe parking?

Safe parking programs provide residents who live in their vehicles a safe place to sleep and access to vital resources.

## **Background: Data**

#### 2020 Point in Time Count:

- Countywide: 11,751 individuals experiencing homelessness, including 2,748 vehicle residents
- East King County Subregion: approximately 300 vehicle residents

#### **December 2021 Informal Count in Bellevue:**

83 vehicle residences

Approximately 50% of unsheltered people experiencing homelessness live in vehicles

## **Program Models**


**OPERATIONS AND SITE TYPES** 

## **Operational Model**

- Recommend centralized site operations:
  - City contract with service provider
  - Provides 24/7 staffing, centralized point of contact, enhanced oversight
  - Case management services tailored to specific needs of vehicle residents; support individuals in addressing barriers and accessing housing
  - Costs vary, initial estimates approximately \$30k
    - \$55k/month depending on program size.


## Site: Religious Organizations

Approximately 75
 religious organizations
 established across
 Bellevue



## Site: Religious Organizations

- May host safe parking on property they own and control
- No code changes required
- Organization provides parking, community support, and access to services
- Support successful safe parking programs with a start-up guide, information-sharing
- Offer access to city-contracted site/case management services



## Site: City-Owned Property Pilot

- 1-year pilot program with careful evaluation of successes and impacts
- Consider allowing variety of vehicle and occupant types
- On-site program management staff 24/7; contract with non-profit provider for site management and case management services
- Ongoing community engagement



## Site: Other Private Property

- Not recommended at this time
- Research needed to identify appropriate property types, site requirements
- Future Land Use Code
   Amendment could address
   regulations for location, size,
   on-site facilities, and other best
   practices
- Recommend contract for onsite program management staff



#### Site: On-Street Zones

- Not recommended
- On-street safe parking typically establishes designated locations for extended parking, with access to services
- Challenges include street maintenance, sanitation, site management
- Would require amendments to the parking ordinance to identify time limits and locations

#### **Next Steps**

- Develop program implementation framework
  - Legal review
  - Establish program goals and metrics
  - Contracting needs, program costs, potential partnerships
  - Identify City-owned property for pilot
  - Develop operational regulations
  - Outreach to religious organizations, other stakeholders
- Budget proposal for consideration in 2023-24 budget



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
