

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6669

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 6557, adopted December 14, 2020, and previously amended, to amend the 2021-2022 Budget to increase the Housing Fund appropriation by \$213,597 to allow the addition of three (3) full-time revenue-backed employee positions to implement and support the Housing Stability Program; providing for severability; and establishing an effective date.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 6557, adopted December 14, 2020, and previously amended, the City Council set the City of Bellevue's 2021-2022 Budget, set forth the estimated revenues and appropriations, and established job classifications and pay ranges; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to further amend Ordinance 6557 and the 2021-2022 biennium budget for the Housing Fund to provide for the addition of three (3) full-time revenue backed employee positions to implement and support the Housing Stability Program; and

WHEREAS, the three (3) employee positions will be funded by RCW 82.14.530 and assigned to Community Development, Parks and Community Services, and ARCH (A Regional Coalition for Housing).

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 6557, adopted December 14, 2020, and previously amended, is hereby amended to amend the 2021-2022 Budget to increase the Housing Fund appropriation by \$213,597 to allow the addition of three (3) full-time revenue-backed employee positions to implement and support the Housing Stability Program, with the three (3) positions to be assigned to Community Development, Parks and Community Services, and ARCH, respectively.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive the monies anticipated herein and to expend the same for the purposes set forth herein.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage and legal publication.
