Whereas: Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates the culture and contributions of Americans tracing

their roots to Spain, Mexico, Central America, South America and the Spanish-speaking

nations of the Caribbean; and

Whereas: The observation of Hispanic Heritage Month started in 1968 under President Lyndon

Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period

starting every year on Sept. 15; and

Whereas: The month of September is significant because it marks the anniversary of independence

for several Latin American countries; and

Whereas: The Hispanic community is Bellevue's third largest population group comprising about

seven percent of the population; and

Whereas: Like many other groups in our nation and community, Hispanic people have been

disproportionally impacted by the unique health and economic challenges of the COVID-

19 pandemic; and

Whereas: Bellevue is a welcoming community and National Hispanic Heritage Month is an important

reminder of how much strength we draw as a region from our immigrant roots and our

values as a nation of immigrants; and

Whereas: The cultural, educational and economic influences of Hispanic residents can be

appreciated in all aspects of life here in the Puget Sound region and throughout the

Eastside.

Now, therefore, I, Lynne Robinson, Mayor of the City of Bellevue, Washington, and on behalf of its City

Council, do hereby proclaim **Sept. 15 to Oct. 15, 2022,** as:

NATIONAL HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

And call upon all Bellevue residents to observe this monthlong recognition and to celebrate the contributions of our Hispanic neighbors with appropriate programs, ceremonies and activities.
