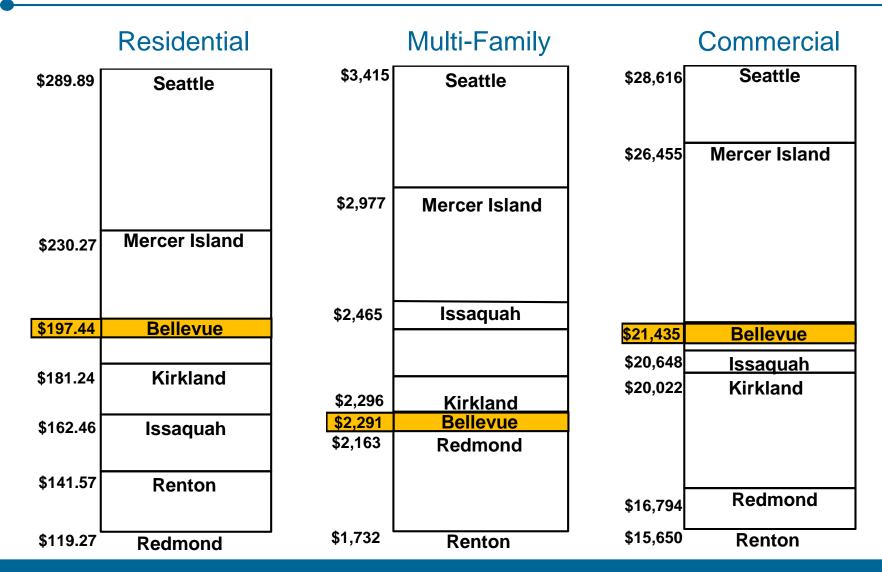
Utilities Business

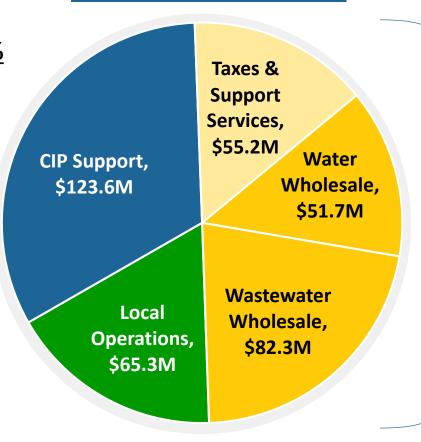

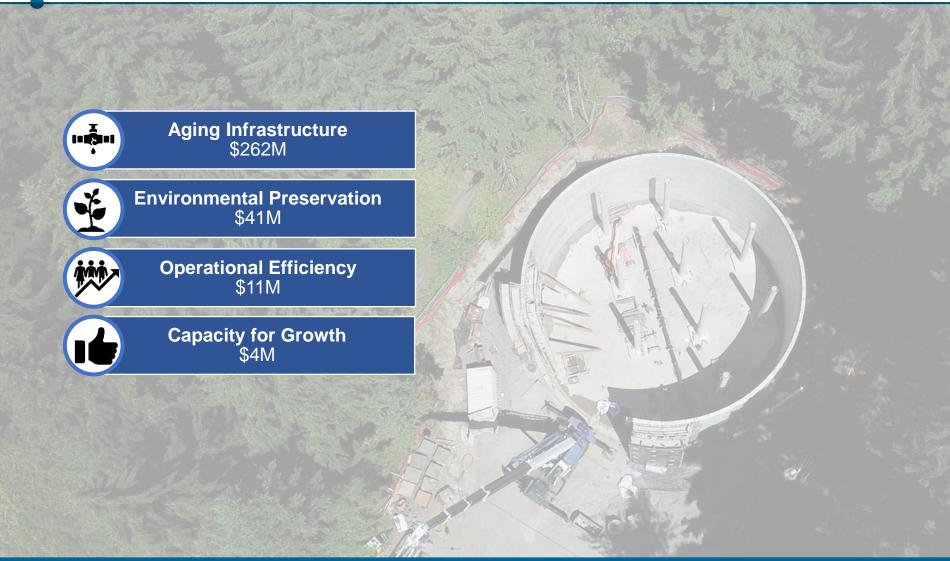

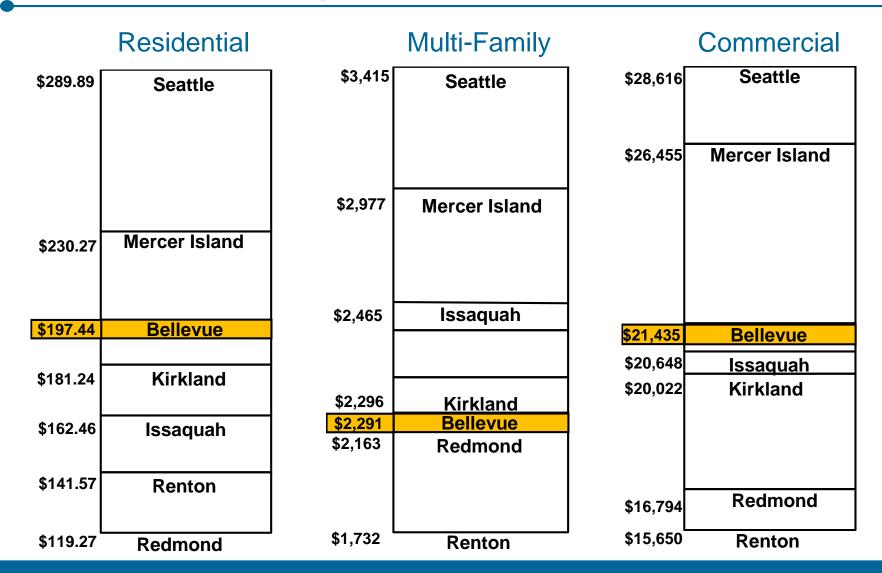

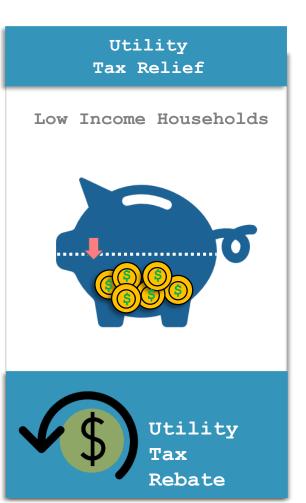
