SUBJECT:	Commission Discussion of ARPA Applicants (Session 1 of 3)

The Commission will discuss the applicants requesting funding for civil legal aid, domestic violence and sexual assault survivor services, and behavioral health services and determine preliminary funding recommendations. The applications were emailed to the commissioners on Tuesday, February 28th. The Commission will determine their preliminary funding recommendations for all applicants over the next three meetings and finalize them at the third meeting on April 4th.

Background

33 Agencies submitted a total of 46 applications requesting over \$6.8 million. The Commission will recommend to the City Council how to distribute the approximately \$3 million available. Below is an overview of the critical needs addressed in this funding round.

Applicant Summary for All Areas

Applicants to Review March 7th: civil legal aid, domestic violence and sexual assault survivor services, and behavioral health services.

Attached you will find the staff framework for your March 7th discussion. Items of note:

- 1. The formula used for each of the three areas ensures a zero balance.
- 2. Agencies within a critical need area were not prioritized. The programs with a higher percentage than others in their area of need have the minimum award proposed (\$30,000).
- 3. The framework has Harborview Abuse & Trauma Counseling moved from behavioral health services to domestic violence and sexual assault survivor services. There are two reasons for this proposed move:
 - a. This counseling service treats violence victims which is consistent with the other providers in domestic violence area.
 - b. This also results in a little more funding to distribute amongst the applicants for behavioral health services for youth and children and people experiencing homelessness.
- 4. The staff formula is meant to serve as a starting point of discussion for the commission only.
