

Attachment C: 2023 One-Time Project Grant Allocations

Program Goals

Project grants provide funding for arts, cultural and heritage projects that serve residents and visitors in Bellevue, Washington. We encourage innovative projects by artists, individuals, and communities that fill cultural gaps and inspire new forms of creative participation. Nonprofit Originations can rank-request three levels of funding, \$3,000 and \$5,000 and \$7,000. Projects must take place in 2023.

Process and criteria for evaluation

Panelists separately reviewed and scored the applications on how well they demonstrated the stated criteria on a scale of 1-10. The scale consists of six qualities in ascending order from no achievement to most achievement: not competitive (1); fair (2-3); good (4-5); great (6-7); excellent (8-9); exceptional (10). Panelists provided scores for the following criteria:

Artistic Innovation

- Quality and promise of the proposed arts, cultural, and heritage project to meet the cultural needs of an audience and constituent group.
- Innovative approach to foster creative and civic participation by Bellevue's diverse residents and visitors, particularly underserved people and communities.
- Fills a gap in art, cultural, or heritage offerings and opportunities not regularly available to Bellevue residents and visitors.
- Fosters artistic excellence and artistic merit.

Public Access and Benefit

- Quality and extent of public benefits offered to Bellevue residents and visitors.
- One or more compelling, feasible public events in Bellevue are clearly described.

Project Feasibility

- Demonstrated experience of project leaders to accomplish the scope and scale of the project.
- Evidence of thoughtful planning, including clearly articulated goals and processes for evaluation.
- Realistic budget and timeline.

Acoustic Sound d/b/a Wintergrass Music Festival	Wintergrass is an annual 4-day indoor bluegrass and Americana festival held at the Hyatt Regency and Westin Hotels in Bellevue offering live acoustic music from 98 local, national and international musicians who perform on five stages. The youth and adult music education programs serve students four years to adulthood, impromptu jamming along with local band showcases and exhibitors. Artma Pop-Up	We are proposing an Artwalk event in the BelRed Arts District (BRAD). This Artwalk will transform four locations into complete immersive experiences. Each location will be created by 2-3 artists. The locations will be within walking distance of one another. Musicians, poets, and dancers will perform in the rooms and in dedicated outdoor spaces. Guided tours will be provided with a map of the Artwalk and the Art Businesses that are part of the BRAD collective. Our 4th of July Orchestra is an opportunity offered to our most advanced students at no cost. Seattle Chinese Cultural Theater	This project is a stage play, Peking Man, written by a famous Chinese playwright Cao Yu (1910-1996) in 1941.
